Dear Christ Church,

These are things we have taken for granted (at least, in my lifetime) and 15 months ago never dreamed were luxuries and gifts from God to be daily thankful for.

Genesis 2:18 says "The Lord God said, 'It is not good for the man to be alone"

To be in company with one another is God ordained, so it is no wonder that lockdown hurt, and as life opens up again it brings with it a joy and a peace that humans so crave. How easy it is to say, but how hard it can be to act on it.

So, as we come out of our "annus horribilis", to quote a very famous person (the Queen), I pray we will begin to see all God's blessings to us in a new

light, and develop an attitude of gratitude for all the gifts. He has given us, including each other and church. And as the church is open again, we look forward to all being back together again, as we are all the poorer for any of us who are missing. Let us be blessings, each to one another, not waiting for others to come to us, but reaching out to whoever God puts across our minds. 
