Meeting together again.

We are all thankful to those who have contributed to the production of online services during the pandemic. For ourselves we have appreciated the convenience of making the sofa and lounge our church in all weathers to watch the services, occasionally we have paused the video to take a telephone call or make a cup of coffee.

Before the Christ Church video, we usually viewed the morning service at our daughter's church in Sydney NSW, where we have seen her and her family occasionally participate in the services.

Zoom has been a great blessing, enabling our house group (and others) to continue. It is not so easy we find to conduct the informal discussions we have when meeting in a home.

Some of our exercise walks have been around the local roads that we would normally only drive through. Some folk step out into the road and pass without speaking or looking, but others seem eager to pause and converse at a safe distance. We have also met church members occasionally along the way.

In recent weeks church has restarted, but we felt for ourselves that it would be wise to wait until two vaccinations plus two weeks had passed. And so, two Sundays ago we ourselves came to church.

We booked our seats and signed in on entry wearing our masks. For safety antibacterial spray is provided, and seating is socially distant. All stand for hymns and remain silent, though some performed actions. It was planned that the closing hymn would be sung on the grass at the back of the church but as it was raining it was cancelled on our first week. In truth it was a little strange, but it is a start. Wearing masks people smiled with their eyes and looked happy to see each other. In our house group we are studying the book of Acts and the word translated 'together' seems to be a key word at the beginning of the book. So, we are told that:

- Following the Ascension of Jesus the disciples 'joined together constantly to pray'. Acts 1¹⁴.
- On the day of Pentecost they were 'all together in one place' as the Holy Spirit filled them. Acts 2⁴⁴.
- Unity. The believers were together and had everything in common. Acts 2¹.
- Worship. Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, Acts 2⁴⁶.

Heavenly Father we pray that the remaining restrictions may be removed and that you will build your church anew. Through your Spirit renew our hearts with a desire to serve him together. Amen.
