Isaiah 42: 1-7

'Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom I delight; I will put my Spirit on him, and he will bring justice to the nations. ²He will not shout or cry out, or raise his voice in the streets. ³ A bruised reed he will not break, and a smouldering wick he will not snuff out. In faithfulness he will bring forth justice; ⁴ he will not falter or be discouraged till he establishes justice on earth. In his teaching the islands will put their hope.' ⁵ This is what God the LORD says – the Creator of the heavens, who stretches them out, who spreads out the earth with all that springs from it, who gives breath to its people, and life to those who walk on it: ⁶ I, the LORD, have called you in righteousness; I will take hold of your hand. I will keep you and will make you to be a covenant for the people and a light for the Gentiles, ⁷ to open eyes that are blind, to free captives from prison and to release from the dungeon those who sit in darkness

The beauty of Isaiah's poetry is breath-taking. This piece has been entitled The Suffering Servant and in it, it is God Himself who speaks. He foretells of a servant, His servant on whom He would put His Spirit, who would bring justice [v1], peace [v2], gentleness [v3], justice and hope [v4], life [v5], light [v6], and freedom [v8] to a broken and hurting world.

What an incredible gift! That our heavenly Father would love us so much that He would send His only Son as the suffering servant to save us from sin and death, with the promise of a world of justice, peace, gentleness, hope, life, light and freedom. What joy that will be when all of this is fulfilled and we live in the world as God always intended it to be.

But while we wait for that time, we often struggle through a life that can sometimes look very different from this. As we head back into a period of uncertainty over this next variant of Covid-19, we once again wonder what lies ahead, how long it will last, what it will look like, will we and our loved ones all be safe, and will Covid ever go?

We may not understand it, but we have a mighty God who has always known this was going to happen, who knows the end from the beginning, and has given wonderful gifts of wisdom and skills to our scientists who work to bring us vaccines; doctors, nurses and support staff to care for those who are ill; and an amazing logistical network to get vaccinations and medicines from the laboratories to an entire nation.

So this Advent, as we draw near to our suffering servant King, and look forward to the wonderful world that will one day be ours, let's thank Him for all the good that is in our world, starting with His provision for help against this horrible disease, and never forgetting that despite all the sensational and often ugly news that bombards us every day – there is still a lot more goodness and kindness in the world than we will ever know. It might not make the headlines for the world's sensational news, but our God is sensational!

I hope this finds you well.

I thought it would be good to send another newsletter a bit sooner than originally planned to update on some answered prayer. Since we last wrote, we have moved house (praise the Lord). Also, Ben has turned 2, and Sarah has also had a birthday, and we have a new (to us) car.

God can grow us in the waiting.

Thank you all for your prayers regarding finding a house to live in, we are happy to be able to say we have now moved into a lovely ground floor apartment in Tours Nord, about 30 mins walk from the church building. We have been looking for 'meubles' (furniture) and are almost there, except a slightly malfunctioning hob. Praise God for His provision. Bizarrely, it was the first flat we visited, just after we had arrived in France. At the time I wasn't sure if we had wanted to live here, then we were rejected on the grounds of our dossier (paperwork mountain) but God provided a way for us to have our dossier accepted (namely an estate agent who wanted to make it work for us, a guarantor, advice from a lawyer in church and Jack's student card all helped, as well as the flat not having been snapped up quickly which was surprising). I think the waiting time has made me more grateful to God for the gift of this place to live, and from which we can be hospitable to others.

Jack's language school

Jack has been studying at the Institut de Touraine for a few weeks now. He has met all sorts of different people, such as a Californian wine grower, a Japanese banker, and a Swedish monk. Jack is enjoying the routine of his studies too, and the travel is much better now we are in Tours Nord.

What else are you up to?

Jack and I had the chance to share our testimonies last week (including Jack speaking French) which I'm told was encouraging. Sarah has been helping with the worship music which she has enjoyed, and will be helping Jody with the creative workshop planning and Jack is going to be helping a bit with the Maison de la Solidarité. - Praise God for answered prayers, such as finding a place to live, finding a car (we now have a Toyota Yaris). Bless Tim and Jane for letting us live in their gite for the first month and a bit.
- Pray for us as we get to know our neighbours (possibly with a housewarming party) and continue to get to know the people in our church
- Pray for us as we look for a 'nounou' or crêche for a few mornings a week for Benjamin. Lots of people use 'nounous' for childcare (people who look after a small group of children in their own homes). You can pray that God guides us to the right person, and someone who is willing to do part time.
- Pray for the 'atelier creatif' on the 11th December. This is a
 creative workshop where normally people bring their own
 crafts to work on together, and people from church invite
 friends to come along. This one is a special Christmas themed
 one and the first in person for a long time due to Covid. Please
 pray that guests would come and feel welcome and experience

something of the love of God, and that the church members would enjoy fellowship together over Christmas crafts!

- Pray for the Christmas celebration on the 19th December (I'm not yet sure what this entails but will find out!)
- Pray for the admin of our CAVIMAC (health & social security) to be ironed out (there have been law changes recently in France meaning that the way things have been done for foreign missionaries previously will have to change slightly).


