Dear Friends,

The Lord in His mercy led us to Latvia back in 2006 to work in what was known at the time as the "Riga International Bible Institute". Later it became known as the "Latvian Biblical Centre" and we took over the leadership in 2008.

We are very grateful and honoured to minister in Latvia and to partner with God and you in a journey of faith and perseverance. We are humbled by the trust that was put towards us personally and LBC as an Institution. With your prayers and support, we have managed to run LBC programmes in different cities across Latvia, as diverse as Liepaja, Talsi, Tukums, Cesis, Daugavpils, Jekabpils and Ergli, and now beyond Latvia.

During these years, you have stood in the gap (Nehemiah 3) when we were facing different challenges, not the least during the restoration of the William Fetler building. What LBC is today is greatly due to your trust, friendship, prayer and financial support. For this, we are deeply grateful to you and to the Lord!

We always felt that our ministry in Latvia is a ministry of helping churches to grow and develop, and that our personal involvement with the Latvian Biblical Centre might not last forever. It was our understanding that when we feel that the Lord is leading us somewhere else, we will consider and pass the ministry of LBC into other hands.

For nearly 2 years we felt that our time in Latvia is drawing to an end and it is time to pass the leadership of LBC on to faithful people who can continue to lead this exciting ministry. We feel that the Lord is leading us to Portugal and, as things are progressing, we will be moving to Portugal in the summer of 2022. We already found a successor for Ester as Academic Dean and we are currently looking for Victor's successor as Director of LBC.

This coming academic year, Ester will introduce the new academic dean to this important role and Ester will terminate her responsibilities in July 2022. During 2021-2022, Victor will carry out interviews to find a suitable director, and will continue as director until 2023. During 2022 until July 2023, Victor will be also travelling to Portugal until he terminates his directorship in July 2023.

We thank the Lord for what we managed to achieve with LBC's ministry and we believe that LBC will continue to build the kingdom of God under a new leadership. Please uphold the ministry of LBC in your prayers.
