It's also been great to be able to pray for each other on a more personal level as part of a housegroup." "I find it a comfort- if in a larger group of church members- to be able to hunt around for some one from 'my' house group to help ground me in the middle of a crowd.

Also, in studies, it's very helpful to draw on the knowledge of others.

Thank you all in my group for your prayers, help and support."

"Housegroup; a place for learning, free from judgement, and discussion about aspects of life from a biblical perspective. And fun."

- "Belonging: You get to church, a crowded room, no-one to speak with, who do you go to? One of your House Group, the first port of call, because it's your comfortable small family unit to get started.
- Banter: You can joke with your House Group friends because you get to know them well, and can enjoy and get away with humour.
- Bible: sermons and talks can be good, but you've no time to stop, think and assess. The slower pace of House Groups means you can ask questions, say something maybe controversial, but it helps you to get to grips with this greatest Book."

And finally:

"The house group has some "oldies" and some "not so oldies" The more able members have been able to help others in practical ways as a labour of love in the Lord."

Sarah Beston. Such a lovely, clever, musical, happy, kind, thoughtful wife, Mum, daughter, teacher and friend.




