# If faith is a journey — how can we explore the path to life?

I have been involved in small groups for most of my adult life and they have been a help in deepening and maintaining my faith. Some years ago, the Reveal survey of thousands of churches showed that the two most important things people need to grow spiritually are spiritual guidance and accountability. Small groups help me to know the Bible better and to understand it better and provide some accountability from a group of people I meet regularly. Put simply if you want to grow as a Christian you should think about being a member of a small group.

Some years ago, we also started small groups or Alpha groups for those who were searching for truth or faith and for those who have a faith but feel they haven't really got to grips with the basics of their faith and wanted a non-threatening space to explore faith. These small groups are based around a meal followed by video material from the hugely successful Alpha course and some discussion of what we have seen and heard.

Over the 10 or 11 weeks of the Alpha course relationships grow and there is the opportunity to explore faith without feeling it is being pushed at you. Kaego and I are excited to be planning our 29th Alpha course with a taster session on 30th September 2021. I know some of you are praying to invite a friend or relative to church on the 5th September to the Back to Church Sunday. Why not invite your friend to come with you to the session on 30th September if they are interested in exploring things further. We have already got one person who has expressed an interest. Over the years a number of our housegroups have developed out of these Alpha groups when people have enjoyed meeting together to explore faith and just want to continue doing so.

#### And on the Knoll Rise housegroup...

We meet once a week and while on Zoom we have started with a few minutes of catch up and chat followed by some material such as a video screen shared and followed by discussion and prayer.

We met for the first time in over 15 months in our garden last week for the last session of term and had a barbecue together. Each term we try and end with a social event, normally based around food. We re-start in September probably physically meeting in our home in Knoll Rise. The format will be fairly similar when we meet in person with coffee and chat followed by some Bible based material that we then discuss and ending with prayer. I would recommend anyone who is not in a house group or alpha group to try it by contacting the leader of the housegroup or the church office.

In the light of the government regulations, and the scientists' recommendations, we are pleased to announce how we will be opening up the church from this Sunday (25th), and...

But to do this safely, we are putting in place a few little guidelines.

The church will have two distinct areas. As you walk in from the front doors, the right-hand side will be for those who wish to wear masks, the left-hand side for those who do not wish to wear masks.

Please leave a chair space between each family group or individual, unless they specifically invite you to sit there.

The balcony will be a sanctuary area where masks, social distancing, and no singing will continue. If you would like to be in the balcony but find it difficult to access it, please can we suggest you sit at the very back of the masked area.

There is no need to book or sign in, hand sanitizer will still be available, we will continue to ventilate the church as much as possible, and the church will still be cleaned and sanitised before and after use.

Please be sensitive when offering the Peace to those who would rather not make physical contact.

Holy Communion will continue as before while we work out how to open this up in the safest way possible.

Thank you all for your support as we have had to enforce regulations that I'm sure not everyone will have agreed with. Willingness to go forwards together, in love, despite differing opinions, is one of the greatest marks of Christian discipleship. And sadly it is one the Church has not always excelled in down through the ages! Thank you, Christ Church, for being a beacon of light in this.
