The Trussell Trust supports a nationwide network of more than 1,200 food bank centres and together we provide emergency food and support to people locked in poverty, and campaign for change to end the need for food banks in the UK.

Harvest is an important time for food banks, with many churches and schools choosing to donate nonperishable food as a way of supporting people who are in need, whilst also celebrating God's provision.

This year the coronavirus pandemic has contributed to unprecedented increases in need for food banks, on top of already rising figures. Food banks in our network saw an 89% increase in need for emergency food parcels during April 2020 compared to the same month last year.

Harvest food collections will play therefore a vital part in keeping our food banks stocked and able to help individuals and families who are in need over the coming months.

We are committed to supporting food banks in our network for as long as they are needed, but we are also committed towards working towards a society in which no-one needs to use a food bank. We believe that, alongside showing compassion and building community, it is also our responsibility to seek justice. This means working together with others to challenge and change systems and structures that keep people trapped in poverty, as well as offering relational and practical support to people in crisis.

Give thanks for the extraordinary generosity, dedication and partnership we have seen at this difficult time, from food bank staff and volunteers, from local churches, from businesses and from the public. This support has made it possible for food banks to continue to provide for people in crisis in very challenging circumstances.

Lament the suffering we are seeing in our society at this time. People losing loved ones, health, jobs, and businesses. Families struggling to make ends meet. Mourn the injustices and inequalities made evident by the pandemic, which communities and individuals have been burdened by for many years.

For hundreds of years, people have been celebrating the end of the season, giving thanks for bountiful harvests and sharing produce with the needy. The tradition started in Pagan times, and was originally called 'Lammas' or 'loaf mass'. People used to make loaves of bread from their new wheat crops and give them to the church for a special communion which marked the start of the harvest – they then celebrated the end by tucking into an apple-stuffed goose dinner on Michaelmas! It was from this yearly practice, that the Harvest festival evolved. Now we mark this celebration by singing, praying and decorating churches with baskets of fruit, vegetables, crops, and corn dollies - in celebration of all the good things in life that God gives us.
