2nd week of Advent

Tomorrow, is the 2nd Sunday of Advent, when we light the 2nd candle of our Advent wreath to remember the prophets.

The prophets foretold the coming of Jesus the Saviour, and of how He would reign in righteousness, justice, and Peace. God sent quite a few prophets to tell people about Jesus' coming so that they could prepare for this momentous event, and Isaiah was one of the major prophets in this.

In the parable of the 10 virgins or bridesmaids, they were told to be ready to welcome the bridegroom when He came. The bridegroom represented Jesus, and all the way through the Bible, the prophets tell people to get ready for Jesus, because He is coming – there is no doubt about this!

In Isaiah chapter 40 verses 1-5 and 9-11, Isaiah tells the people that comfort is coming - their Messiah! They have been through difficult times. But they have also sinned, and they have suffered because of their sins. But now God is speaking comfort to them, and with this comfort comes peace. So, as we remember the prophets with this 2nd Advent candle, we also think about 'peace'.

Everything seems to be very busy – both as we deal with Covid at this time, and also in usual life. There is always so much to do, and so much to think about, and we seem to become human 'doings' rather than human 'beings'.

What do you think of when you hear the word peace? Do you think of lack of conflict? Do you think of quiet things? Do you think of sleeping in your bed? What places do you find peacefulness? Do we take enough time in our busy days to have "peaceful" times?

Is there anything we can we do this week to find a time of peace, a place of peace, or a time of quiet where we're not running around? Because it is there that we can prepare our hearts for Jesus. Just as the prophets told people about Jesus' coming; and that they needed to make the way clear for Him to come to them, we need to prepare ourselves too; say sorry for the things

we have done wrong, and make ourselves quiet so that we can hear Him too.

Yes, one of the things we need to do is say sorry to God for bad things we've done. That was a big message of the prophets, John the Baptist, and Jesus, and this helps us prepare ourselves for Jesus to come to us. Whether it's a small thing or a big thing, we still need to tell God and say sorry for it.

We don't need to be scared or worried about it though. He already knows and He will always forgive us. We are always forgiven by God if we say sorry and mean it.

So this advent, let's prepare ourselves, as the prophets told people to prepare for Jesus's coming:

Lord, from where we are to where You have for us; **Jesus, help us.**

From the security of what we know to the adventure of what You reveal; **Jesus, help us.**

To make this world look more like Your kingdom; **Jesus, help us.**

In Your mighty name, we pray, Amen.

Blue Christmas




