Dear everyone,

Before Christmas, in Advent, a very kind person put a Christmas wreath on the gatepost of our drive, between us and the church. It was beautiful! Truly lovely, with roses and other flowers, seasonal greenery, pearl and silver sprayed ornaments, and oasis' in it filled with water to keep it alive as long as possible. It meant that whenever we came into, or went out of our house, it was a blessing to see. It was a blessing to the church, as people may see it as they came and left. It was also a blessing to any who walked past, as it was right next to the pavement. I have asked many people in an attempt to find the kind person who did it so I could thank them, but as yet, to no avail. If you are the kind person, please will you let me know so I can thank you properly?

Because it was so beautiful, we left it there as long as we possibly could, until the flowers were so dead and brown that we thought we really had to move it...

...but then we noticed that our Forsythia was in bloom. So, all we needed to do was to replace the flowers of Advent on the wreath with the flowers of whatever season we were in, and it could go on giving pleasure for as long as the wreath base itself lasted. Joy!

And I think we can be a little like that with other areas of our lives and journeys with the Lord. When we are given a lovely gift or ministry, which maybe has a season, sometimes we are anxious to prolong it as long as possible because we love it so much. We maybe even hang on to it after it has started to wilt and even show signs of dying. We remember back to when it was so good, and want it to last as long as possible. But seasons change Ecclesiastes 3 points out, and now we are finding that winter is starting to give way to early spring blossom and bulbs. And it is as we recognise that our season in one area may have come to its end and accept it, that we can embrace the next season that God may have for us which will bring a new beauty all of its own, different from the last beauty, but just as good.

In my own life, it is often as I look back that I recognise where God was moving me on from something, even though I was happy where I was. There are only two times when I have been blessed to hear His audible voice audibly, and once was when He told me to go to another church, even though I was happy where I was and didn't want to move. But what I didn't know was that He was taking me into an even greater ministry there, as it was from there that I was launched into my journey towards becoming a priest. New seasons are good!

Do take a look at the wreath if you go past our house, and hopefully it will reflect the changing seasons as we go through them. And a huge thank you again to the kind person who gave it to us. May the Lord bless you as you have blessed us.


Dear Christ Church,
