Peace

Many years ago, my mother passed on to me her Promise Box that she had bought when she was a teenager nearly 80 years ago. It contains a small

drawer that is packed with little scrolls, each containing a promise, and prayer, and a piece of poetry, which need gentle tweezers to prize out. The one I picked out today read:



- Promise: A blessing if ye obey the commandments of the Lord your God. Deuteronomy 11:27
- Prayer: Lord, I believe; help Thou mine unbelief. Mark 9:24
- Poetry: Ah, the heart that is contented, Nought to know save God alone, In the fullness of His blessing Finds a peace before unknown.

In Deuteronomy, God promises a blessing if we obey His commandments. How many of us would appreciate a blessing today?

In Mark, the man who was coming to Jesus for healing for his son, knew the difficulty of absolute belief in Jesus' name, and bewailed his lack of belief, but had the faith to know that if he asked Jesus to help his unbelief, then he would be helped. How many of us would appreciate having all our fears and doubts washed away by Jesus?

The poem was written by someone who knew the true secret to blessing and peace, but whose name has long since disappeared, if indeed it was ever known. It reminds us that true contentment lies in putting God not just at the centre of our lives, but making Him the only thing that we strive for. Making God our all-in-all, without all the worldly wants crowding in for second and third place. That is where He will bless us with His perfect peace.

We live in a world where so many things press for our desire and attention, but as Jesus said to Martha in Luke 10 when she was complaining that Mary was

just sitting at Jesus' feet leaving her (Martha) to do all the work 'Martha, Martha,' the Lord answered, 'you are worried and upset about many things, but few things are needed – or indeed only one. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her.'

We only need one thing – to make God our everything – and let the world go. And no, we aren't all called to be hermits, but we are all called to *our* place in life, and in that place, Jesus wants our all.

How I wish this was as easy to put into practice as it is to say! Thankfully Jesus knows this, and leads us with cords of loving kindness on our journeys into Him. He did all that was needed for us on the cross we just need to content our hearts with Him, putting everything into His hands, and enjoy the blessing of His peace.

And this is something that we can pass on to those we might invite to come and hear J.John, or those that ask us about what it means to follow Jesus. In Jesus, we find peace, His peace, a deep personal peace. Things will still happen and go wrong, but we can have peace because He is with us and in us. He journeys with us through everything, and His promise is that He will never leave us.




Christ Church Orpington (Open Kitchen)
