# 7 Last Words of Jesus - Part One

# Father forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing (Luke 23:34)

There are many ways of thinking about Easter. One with a long tradition is to consider what Jesus said while he was on the cross. The four Gospel writers record seven sayings (traditionally called the 'Seven Last Words') spoken by Jesus on the cross, which overflow with meaning. Taken together they sum up what Easter – and Christianity – means.

The background is that some time in the morning of the first Good Friday, immediately after the evening that saw the start of the feast of the Passover, Jesus was nailed to the cross. The Gospel writers record that, as Jesus hung on the cross, from noon to three in the afternoon an unexplained darkness fell upon the earth. It is a darkness that echoes what Christ experienced: a death somehow worse than death.

Here, in the first of the seven sayings, Jesus offers up a prayer for his persecutors: 'Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing.' In view of what Jesus says later on, it is important to notice that here he refers to God as 'Father' or, in the original Aramaic, 'Abba'. This was the normal way that Jesus prayed to God, showing how he knew God in a personal way.

The really important thing here is the way that Jesus prays for others. It is a remarkable prayer. Most of us have problems praying for good people at good times. What is remarkable here is that Jesus is able

to pray for bad people at a bad time. Here, in this desperate situation and in appalling pain, Jesus' concern remains for others. In praying like this, he is living out his own teaching: 'But to you who are listening I say: love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who ill-treat you' (Luke 6:27–28). Jesus is that extraordinary rarity in human history: a moral teacher who lives out what he says. Notice, too, the content of the prayer; Jesus pleads, 'Forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing.' Jesus puts forward what we might call in legal language 'extenuating circumstances' — the fact that his persecutors didn't fully realise that they were mocking and torturing the Messiah, the Son of God.

In his first letter, the apostle John writes, 'My dear children, I write this to you so that you will not sin. But if anybody does sin, we have an advocate with the Father — Jesus Christ, the Righteous One' (1 John 2:1). St John uses a legal term ( $\pi\alpha\rho\dot{\alpha}\kappa\lambda\eta\tau\sigma\nu$ ) to describe the role of Jesus, a word we might translate as 'defence lawyer'. What this word actually means in practice is shown perfectly on the cross.

Jesus asks his heavenly Father to forgive people and offers every possible excuse for them. That's what we all need, even the best of us: a God who, in Jesus, is on our side and who speaks on our behalf.



food from supermarkets for some time, through the FareShare charity, with the aim of preventing food waste. From this food, we made meals for our Community Club, and then local hospitals. Later we delivered food to local residents living in food poverty or going through difficult times. However, in May 2020 we were offered FareShare slots with other supermarkets and so Open Kitchen was born, as we invited recipients to collect from us if they could.

We receive donations from supermarkets and other food outlets several times a week, there are twenty team members and we have our own dedicated fridge and freezer. We offer fresh, chilled and frozen food to about 90 households per week and are still looking to expand. No vouchers are required. Some recipients are in need of food, others hate to see food waste. Anything that can no longer be offered through Open Kitchen is donated to Foal Farm for animal feed. Come and see what we do on Tuesday and Friday mornings or Sunday afternoons. We'd love to see you so we can make even more of a difference!
