The nature of success

I have been musing on the meaning of victory recently. What does success look like? Does it look different to us as it looks to God? Having just celebrated Easter, we remembered on Palm Sunday how Jesus rode into Jerusalem in the equivalent of a king's victory parade, and yet he rode on a donkey rather than on a warrior horse. Within days, Pilate, Herod and the religious leaders believed they had silenced Jesus by nailing him to a cross. They thought they had won. And yet we know that salvation was bought by the death of Jesus. Just three days later, there was more success in spiritual terms when Jesus rose from the dead; he had beaten death itself. There are so many contradictions in the Easter story - a humble king, salvation through death, and victory through new life.

Many of us have been transfixed by news of the terrible conflict in Ukraine over the last two months. Western leaders, as well as the political leaders in Ukraine and Russia have been laying out what victory would look like from their perspective. Russia seems to have changed its goals in the country, while national leaders in NATO also seem to have widened their objectives. It's hard to say what success would look like in Ukraine. The war there, just as in conflicts elsewhere in the world, has left behind shattered dreams, damaged homes and broken lives.

And yet, while God weeps with those who weep, and mourns with those who mourn, we also know that the Holy Spirit is stirring in Ukraine. There has been an increased demand for Bibles since the conflict; many have turned to prayer; and miracles have been witnessed. Our Father can bring good out of evil; he can turn things around in amazing ways. We give thanks for all the blessings he's brought out of such a difficult situation in Ukraine, as in other war zones.

Our society is in many ways success driven. We probably all know a young person preparing for the approaching exam season, and we wish all of them well. What does success look like there? Passing a certain number of exams? Finding a well-paid job or apprenticeship? Accepted on to a course at a top university? Our prayer is of course that all students will do their very best, but God's view of success in life is rather different. He asks us to lay up for ourselves treasures in heaven, to follow in the footsteps of Jesus, and to love God

with all our heart, soul, mind and strength. God values each one of us and doesn't measure success in how popular we are, in the power we wield, in the wealth we build for ourselves, or in the grades we obtain. Can we be more loving, joyous, peaceful, patient, kind, generous, faithful, gentle and self-controlled? Wouldn't it be wonderful if we could view success in the way God views it?
