

Dear everyone,

I hope you are having a good week, and have managed to enjoy the warmth and sun that is hopefully pre-empting a warm summer this year!

What do you think of when you hear the word 'evolution'?

Is it 'progress'?

Or how things 'change' throughout a generation?



Or is it how some foods have got smaller over the years?



Well, Oxford University has been continuously studying for 75x years a population of Great Tits in their own 'Living Laboratory' at Wytham Woods. They started on 27th April 1947 with the first Great Tit egg of that year, and this year (2022), the first egg was produced virtually exactly 1x month earlier, on 28th March 2022.

What does this tell us? Did the bird get confused and produce the egg earlier by accident? Was there a change in the weather that meant the egg would be in danger if it was produced late April as per 1947?

Has global warming and climate change altered over time the calendar for the bird?

The researchers say that "[an] enduring insight of the study is how the birds have evolved sensitive environmental awareness, laying eggs timed so that they hatch to coincide with the hatching of the eggs of several caterpillar species, the main food source for great tit chicks. The caterpillars themselves feed on newly-emerged deciduous leaves".

Another report says "New research reveals British great tits have evolved to grow longer beaks than their European counterparts." and this could be to do with learning to use bird feeders over the years. The UK is said to use about 2x times the amount of bird seed and feeders when compared to mainland Europe, so this could be a contributor!

So, could these two changes be considered as 'evolution' of the Great Tit species?

And if so, are they useful, and why does it matter?

Thinking of my own life, I started off in the womb being taken to church, and have continued ever since. And looking in particular at my adult Christian life, you could say some things have evolved, or progressed for the better.

There have been times when I was younger that I thought I had learned all I needed to on a certain subject or experience, and therefore, any learnings on those needed no more attention, focussing on other things that I felt needed it instead. But as I continued through earthly life, I have found that some of those things have been helpful to re-visit!

The Great Tit study shows that there had been unusually cool or warm springs, and the laying of their eggs has not coincided with their food being around, so unfortunately, a number of the species didn't live those years. But by evolving to produce eggs similarly to their food, they have a stronger chance of life.

With my reading of the Bible, prayer, and relationship with God, I have found that I can never get to that point of knowing enough, and need to 'evolve' or make better my ways and/or understanding as I go on through life. And if we allow Him, God will continue to grow us all the time, so that we can have a stronger change of life with Him.

May I encourage you to think about continuous 'evolving' or getting even closer in your relationship with God, in whatever way that works for you. And if you have no idea, then God Himself, as He is the best person to ask how :)


