Reflection

We are very blessed every Saturday by a thoughtful and grace-filled reflection from Pieter to guide us in our Day of Prayer, so I thought I would share some of them with you over the next few weeks so you can journey with us too.

This week Pieter wrote:

"In the weeks after Easter I can sometimes feel a strange yearning for the celebration that's behind us. Earlier this week I read the following quote that made me think:

"The gospel is not just something we need to preach to non-believers - it's something we need to preach to ourselves everyday."

So to actually accept what Jesus did for me on the cross, I realised (again) is a constant action I need to take.

¹³You were dead because of your sins and because your sinful nature was not yet cut away. Then God made you alive with Christ, for he forgave all your sins. ¹⁴He cancelled the record of the charges against us and took it away by nailing it to the cross. ¹⁵In this way, he disarmed the spiritual rulers and authorities. Colossians 2:13-15 NLT

Read that again and see what it says in verse 13, forgave ALL our sins; so how then can I to hold onto some of it.

What I need to do every time the accuser (satan) tries to put thoughts in my head of a sinful and guilty me, I can say it over and over again... "It is finished" Amen!!

Let's kneel together before $\operatorname{\mathsf{God}}$ and thank him for this gift of grace."

Thank you Pieter for this wonderful word of truth. Let us indeed appropriate those beautiful words that if we are in Him then our sins are forgiven, and shout Jesus' triumphant words "It is finished" with joy when the accuser tries to put charges of sin and guilt into our heads. Satan has been defeated and we are free from all condemnation. Thank you Jesus, Amen.

Sermon Notes for Sunday 15th May

Our current Sunday morning sermon series is using themes and ideas from Rick Warren's book

"The Purpose Driven Life: What on Earth Am I Here For?"

This week we are looking at the

Purpose #1 You Were Planned for God's Pleasure.

The book offers the following points to ponder

Day 1 Point to Ponder: I was planned for God's pleasure.
Verse to Remember: "The LORD takes pleasure in his people."
Psalm 149:4a (TEV)

Question to Consider: What common task could I start doing as if I were doing it directly for Jesus?

Day 2 Point to Ponder: God smiles when I trust him.

Verse to Remember: "The Lord is pleased with those who worship him and trust his love." Psalm 147:11 (CEV)

Question to Consider: Since God knows what is best, in what areas of my life do I need to trust him most?

Day 3 Point to Ponder: The heart of worship is surrender. Verse to Remember: "Surrender your whole being to him to be used for righteous purposes." Romans 6:13b (TEV)

Question to Consider: What area of my life am I holding back from God?

Day 4 Point to Ponder: God wants to be my best friend. Verse to Remember: "Friendship with God is reserved for those who reverence him." Psalm 25:14a (LB)

Question to Consider: What can I do to remind myself to think about God and talk to him more often throughout the day?

Day 5 Point to Ponder: I'm as close to God as I choose to be. Verse to Remember: "Draw close to God, and God will draw close to you." James 4:8a (NLT)

Question to Consider: What practical choices will I make today in order to grow closer to God?

Day 6 Point to Ponder: God wants all of me.

Verse to Remember: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength." Mark 12:30 (NIV)

Question to Consider: Which is more pleasing to God right now my public worship or my private worship? What will I do about this?

Day 7 Point to Ponder: God is real, no matter how I feel.

Verse to Remember: "For God has said, 'I will never leave you; I will never abandon you." Hebrews 13:5 (TEV)

Question to Consider: How can I stay focused on God's presence, especially when he feels distant?
