

# The TOOMORE School Project

...Direct Help for Children and Young People with Special Needs and Disabilities In Kwara State, Western Nigeria







The Reverend Samuel Ajayi started the TOOMORE School in Ilorin, Kwara State, Western Central Nigeria, in 2006, in response to the dire need for children and adolescents with special needs or impairments. It now serves 60 children ages 5 to 18 and 27 adolescents ages 19 to 24. About 28 of them (18 boys and 10 girls) live in the school hostel all year, either because their parents have died or because they were abandoned.

During a 3-day virtual training in May 2022, OAKonsult documented specific requirements identified by the school with immediate impact on children and youth. TOOMORE School stands apart because of the caliber and diversity of its employees!

Every day, these 16 people work hard to care for and educate children and teens with disabilities under their care. This is true even though they work in very hard and stressful situations, have few resources, and care deeply about the kids' well-being.

Despite their insufficient monthly salaries of between N12,000 and N35,000 (£20 to £50), and at the cost of their own well-being, the **staff stay put to alleviate the suffering of these young people.** The team displays strong unity and complete dedication to the cause, which some of them refer to as a "calling."

In addition to the permanent personnel at TOOMORE School, four National Youth Service Corps (NYSC) members are also stationed there for their mandatory year of service. They have also absorbed the institution's supportive attitude toward children and adolescents with impairments. **Through their work, they are changing attitudes.** 

Tó Omo Ré (taw awmo reh)
- literarily translates as:
"take care of your children".



People living with disabilities in Nigeria persistently face stigma, discrimination, battery, and barriers to accessing basic social services and economic opportunities. Today, they face even greater barriers due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.

# **BACKGROUND**

They usually experience negative attitudes at family and community levels, including name-calling, negative beliefs and misconceptions surrounding the causes of disability, usually associated with religious or cultural norms or beliefs. This <u>leads to rejection</u>, <u>neglect</u>, <u>loss of respect</u>, <u>denial of identity or self-worth and often low self-esteem</u>, <u>depression and loneliness</u>\*. This, along with structural limitations and challenges, also reinforces barriers for people with disabilities to basic services such as education, health, public transport, and social safety nets.

Research shows that <u>"only one in every ten children with disabilities has access to education in Africa".</u>\*\*

OAKonsult is therefore committed to supporting this school, which demonstrates a passion and willingness to educate children and young adults with special needs in their care. The results from a complimentary strategy session, as part of our capacity building efforts for the staff of this institution, highlighted the immediate and critical needs for the school. This therefore forms the basis of our appeal.
