

Reflection

The Bible is so full of wonderful promises and affirmations that we can cling onto every day of our lives. The following verses in John 14:13-15 I find quite mind boggling:

"And I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it. If you love me, keep my commands."

Jesus literally says 'you may ask me for anything'. Wow!!

It makes me think of, when my kids were small, they would come to me and say something like; 'if I ask you something, promise that you will say yes'. And as a Dad I would be very suspicious of what's to follow... but not Jesus; He delights in saying 'yes'!

But Jesus also follows up by saying 'love me & keep my commands'. When we look into His commands, they do not seem too hard (on the face of it):

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'Love your neighbour as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these."

Mark 12:30-31 NIV

Now therein lies the secret - if we can keep the command of Mark 12:30-31 (let's just pretend we can for a minute) how would we wield the powerful gift bestowed on us in John 14:14. I find these verses are so beautifully interlinked.

As we come before God this day in prayer, let us ask Him to guide us in conversation with Him, so that our prayers will also be met with a loving 'Yes' from our Father.



We spent about 3 weeks back in the UK in June, visiting family and friends, attending a wedding, preaching (Jack not me!) and joining in with the mission week in King's church in Durham, particularly on the Sherburn Road estate where we used to be part of a missional community. So, it was a blend of 'home assignment' and 'holiday' (work and play!).


The June Project mission week in Durham was tiring but very encouraging. We were very blessed to be able to stay in the house of some church members who were away. Our church in France is around 50 people on a full Sunday, so worshipping with a much larger group and in our mother tongue was in itself refreshing. So was seeing how God was at work in the church and in the council estate (Sherburn Road estate) where we used to live. Ben was a trooper being dragged around to all sorts of places, but in a way I think he's glad to be back to normal routine now!

In some ways 3 weeks felt too short to see all of the people we wanted to see. I also think I experienced a bit of reverse culture shock. For me it took the form of feeling very disoriented on London public transport, and finding it hard to put into words what we have experienced so far in France. It was also bitter-sweet to catch up with family and old friends and new arrivals, knowing that we've missed out on a chunk of time with them.

And then we came back to France! We praise God that, on the day we arrived back, some friends from the church in France sent WhatsApp messages asking about how things were, and a couple of days later I went to a church meeting about Sunday mornings which was encouraging. These things helped as we began to transition back to life here, missing old friends but confident of having good work to do here and new friends to see.

Summer slow down

Lots of things seem to take a slower pace here in Tours in the summer. Lots of families are going away. This means that Sunday school isn't running during the summer holidays in church. Also, the English lessons at the *Maison de la solidarité* have paused until September. It has given an opportunity to reflect - were we too busy before? Is there anything we need to prioritise or de-prioritise in September? We will also take 1 week of holiday with family in August, making the most of this slower period.

Maison 'bla bla'

Since *la maison de la solidarité* is a bit of a mouthful, sometimes we call it the above name. Not to French people. The way we will be volunteering here is changing a bit. I've switched to doing the welcome desk on a Friday, which is when the food bank is running, which is busier. Please pray for wisdom in how to do this role with authority and gentleness. Jack may be taking on more responsibility soon as a retired volunteer is considering stepping down (responsibilities including receiving and sorting donations for the charity shop, helping organise jumble sales, organising volunteers, driving a big white van :-)).

Musical worship and tech in the church

The last couple of Sunday mornings have been encouraging. Please pray for continued good teamwork within the worship team. One key person is moving away soon. We currently don't have anyone doing tech (sound desk, wires, and other things I don't understand). Do pray that the Lord would prompt someone/some people to serve in this way. You can also pray that the worship team moves forward with the vision expressed in a recent meeting of involving more church members in the 'up front' things on Sunday morning, and to make the worship more creative and varied, and that the other worship leader (who has a full-time secular job) wouldn't be stressed by these extra 'things to do', and that doing exciting creative things would never become an end in itself but would help people to engage with God and bless His name.

Please pray for:

- 1. A refreshing time on holiday at Le Pas Opton with family during the first week of August.
- 2. Jack's upcoming sermons (17th July, 14th August). We are currently doing a sermon series in Acts.
- 3. I'm trying to organise a social event for the church youth. It is proving more difficult than expected to find a time that works during the summer holidays. Please pray that if it is God's will we will be able to find a time and that it would be a fun time for the youth to enjoy being together
- 4. New believers, and people seeking, for the Holy Spirit to be at work in their hearts, and for difficult situations that may prevent them committing to Jesus to be overcome (e.g. some family members thinking protestant church is a cult...). Encouragingly, one person has started coming to our church off the back of a flyer for an event that the team from Durham put on in April, which was, it seemed at the time, a 'flop'.
- Blessing on our team life especially as and when disagreement arises. Between Dutch, American and Brits we could have quite different styles of disagreeing, not taking into account personalities :-) Praise God that so far this has been good.
- 6. Work at the maison de la solidarité. Good relationships with volunteers and clients, Jack as he takes on more responsibility.
- 7. Musical worship and tech in the church. For provision of tech people in particular!
- 8. Benjamin going to school in September! (yes, they do start them young here!).
- 9. Continuing to make friends in and outside of church.
- 10. Our walks with Jesus, that this would be our priority, over and above all the 'doing'
- 11. Mini newcomers conference with our mission agency ECM in August
