I heard the South African evangelist, Angus Buchan, say the following:

"When men work, they work; but when men pray, God works" - how cool is that!

We are so fortunate that throughout the Bible we can see numerous examples of what amazing miracles prayer is able to unlock. If we look at the time when Peter was imprisoned:

"But while Peter was in prison, the church prayed very earnestly for him." Acts of the Apostles 12:5

This was the night before Peter was to stand trial, but the believers decided that God needs to intervene and they got on their knees. And as if by 'magic' in verse 7...

We hope you had a merry Christmas and wish you much blessing for the coming year! Here is a look back at our year - a year mixed with joy and sadness.

A final farewell...



Last Christmas we got a phone call saying that Jim's dad, Mike, was in hospital and not doing well. Within a few days Jim had flown over to Devon and met up with his mum. His brother, Jon was also able to fly over from Sydney. In total Jim spent six weeks there - the longest time ever away from the family. His dad passed away peacefully at the end of January at home in his own bed with his dog at his side and a glass of wine in his hand. We are thankful that Jim's dad was able to live fully independently right up until his final illness shortly after his 85th birthday. Also, to be able to spend so much time together with his mum and brother was a real silver lining. The last moments were quite dramatic though and it left us wondering whether Mike had taken his last chance to make things right before he went.

His word to us starts to be fulfilled...

Four years ago we moved down south to Freiburg following a prophetic word we received - 'Hop, step, jump!' The hop was the move, to be followed by regular steps into France, before eventually a jump there in one shape or other. This last year has again seen some exciting steps - in June Jim took a team of ten to work with YWAM Provence to reach out on the streets, parks and lakes. It was truly an incredible week. One of the highlights was as a group of three of us walked through a park. As we passed by a café I had an impression where I saw myself walk into the café, order an orange juice

and ask for a Melanie. So, we walked in and ordered drinks before doing exactly that. The girl behind the bar said that Melanie wasn't there yet. We shared that we prayed for healing for people. Well Melanie certainly needs that she replied! To cut a long story short we could pray for both that girl and for Melanie when we finally met her the next evening. What an encounter! On another occasion we were walking around a lake and met three groups of people. Almost all had pain and everyone was healed when we laid hands on them and prayed. In all 9 people got healed that afternoon and we were able to share the good news with them. During the week several people also gave their lives to Jesus. This coming year we hope to treble the number of steps into France and are excited to see what develops.

It's been a big year of finals for our eldest two kids with Amy successfully completing her psychology degree from Exeter, and Rick also getting excellent grades in his equivalent of A-levels. We are enjoying having Amy back home living with us again. Neither know exactly what's coming next but both have internships planned in the

New Year and will be applying for various degree courses here in Germany starting next Autumn. Mark has settled into his secondary school and is doing well. Susi is in her last year at her school finishing off with GCSE equivalents in the summer. She is thinking of applying to a do a graphic designer training next year.



On the road again...

After the restrictions in the last two years because of Covid, it has been great to travel more normally again. We visited family and friends in Spain, and the UK for the first time since summer 2019. Also, we had teaching and outreach trips to France, Holland, Switzerland and various places in Germany (Altensteig, Bad Blankenburg, Berlin, Hamburg and Hurlach).

Base life..

Both of us taught on our current DTS (Discipleship Training School). Katie also cooked once a week for 35 people and mentors one of the students. The school is our biggest one yet in Freiburg with 20 students from 8 different nations and 8 staff. They're currently on outreach in three teams in Africa, South America, and Asia.



Local Church

This year has seen us feeling well integrated into our local church. Katie has preached a number of times now since her debut last year. She has been taking parts of her "Hearing God's Voice" teaching and adapting them into 30 minute

messages. It's definitely more challenging doing it in German but it always goes down well. She is also leading a children's Sunday school group. Both of us are also in the prayer team. Jim has preached too and recently joined the leadership team.

Rick in Hawaii

Having finished school in July, Rick has spent the last three months helping out practically on the YWAM base in Kona, Hawaii. He's had a great time whilst the rest of us have been freezing in Europe, and at the end of November he got baptised.
