

Reflection

Earlier this week I did a short Bible reading plan with a few friends and this stirred up so many relevant points that I would like to share. One of the readings was from Psalms 46:1-11 and it is as relevant today as it was when it was first written.

As we come before the Lord in prayer join me in using this Psalm as a guide:

"So we will not fear when earthquakes come and the mountains crumble into the sea." v2 (NLT)

Lord we continue to bring before you the destruction and misery experienced by the people of Turkey and Syria. We ask for your mighty hand to be seen in the disaster relief and humanitarian aid. We pray that as an outflow of this calamity people will show love, compassion and inclusion, so that what is rebuilt will be a beacon of hope for all to witness.

"The nations are in chaos, and their kingdoms crumble! God's voice thunders, and the earth melts!" v6 (NLT)

What an absolute mess the world is in! It is hard to think of a nation, our own included, that is not in a mess... politicians without morals or accountability, businesses that profiteer from the rise in energy costs whilst the vast majority of individual households are making cutbacks because of the cost of living, and systems and factions divided and pointing fingers which only divides people further as love is flushed down the drain!

And while all this is unfolding around us and on our television screens, war remains a reality for so many innocent people around the world. We are acutely aware of Russia's onslaught on the Ukrainian population, but let's not forget Myanmar, Afghanistan, Ethiopia, Mexico (drug war), Yemen, the unfortunately goes (see www.worldpopulationreview.com).

"He causes wars to end throughout the earth. He breaks the bow and snaps the spear; he burns the shield with fire." v9 (NLT) This is the Word of God! So, we can pray into these situations and God will intervene, because He is faithful and true.

So, as we unpack all these things in our minds it can be overwhelming and we can feel completely lost, until we read a bit further:

"Be still, and know that I am God! I will be honoured by every nation. I will be honoured throughout the world." v10 (NLT)

And still after all that we can be forgiven for crying out: But how Lord, how will this even happen!?!?

"The Lord of Heaven's Armies is here among us; the God of Israel is our fortress." v11
