REMINDER: National test of the UK Emergency Alerts service on Sunday 23 April at 3pm



The UK government's new Emergency Alerts system is now live.

A UK-wide test of the life-saving public Emergency Alerts system will take place on **Sunday 23 April at 3pm.**

The system gives the government and emergency services the capability to send an alert directly to mobile phones when there is a risk to life, such as severe flooding.

Alert systems such as this are already successfully used across the world and save lives.

The alert and church services

The alert itself will take the form of a message on mobile phone home screens, accompanied by a loud, siren-like sound and vibration that will last about 10 seconds, even if the device is set to silent.

For the nationwide test on 23 April, the public does not need to take any action – the sound and vibration will stop automatically after 10 seconds.

Reflection

I have been pondering the concept of doing everything we do as if we do it for the Lord. As a standalone sentence it seems to be great but working that into my everyday life; now that's another story.

For starters, and I have confessed this before, I so often fall into the trap of yearning for acceptance by others. I wouldn't say I am necessarily seeking the approval of others, but I am acutely conscious of what others may think of me, my actions and my inactions. I don't believe I live in fear of their perceived judgment but for some reason that I struggle to explain or understand, it is almost always there in the back of my mind.

I have made a conscious decision to fear the Lord only, which has helped me tremendously; but I still fall victim to my 'instincts', where I at least try and conform to some human standards. I find this incredibly annoying in myself because for some years now I have had a recurring entry in my diary every fortnight which reads:

"This is my command - be strong and courageous! Do not be afraid or discouraged. For the Lord your God is with you wherever you go."

Joshua 1:9 NLT

It is a permanent entry in my diary because I need to hear it and read it and internalise it; over and over again!

As we pray together today may I suggest three verses from both the Old and New Testaments for us to pray into and let His words speak into our hearts. As these verses speak to us let these thoughts turn into actions so that we can life the lives Jesus had planned for us all along!

Loyalty to our audience of One:

"Their loyalty is divided between God and the world, and they are unstable in everything they do."

Walking in authority that can only be bestowed by God:

"Yes, I have given him the land of Egypt as a reward for his work, says the Sovereign Lord, because he was working for me when he destroyed Tyre."

Deanery Synod membership

Would you like to be a part of great parliament of the church?

Deanery Synod elections are happening this spring, but what's it all about? What's a deanery synod?

Deaneries are groups of Anglican parishes in a geographical area. Orpington Deanery stretches from St Barnabas in St Paul's Cray in the north to Biggin Hill in the south, and from St Francis Petts Wood in the west to St Marys in St Mary Cray in the east.

The Deanery Synod is part of the way the Church of England gives people at different levels a chance to have their say. It sits between the parishes with their Parochial Church Councils (PCCs) and the full diocese, with its Diocesan Synod.

Deanery Synods are formal meetings for conversation, discussion and decision-making on matters relating to mission and ministry, not just in the local area, but also Diocesan-wide. It is expected, for example, that any change in doctrine following the recent motion accepted recently by General Synod after the 'Living in Love and Faith Report', will come down to Deanery Synod to vote upon. They meet three or four times a year, visiting a different church in the Deanery each time.

Any healthy church is a church where everyone feels they have a voice. Deanery Synods need your voice, because we need all the voices to create that bigger picture. If you have ever felt frustrated or wondered why certain decisions were being made, then now is the time to take action and make your point heard. Put yourself forward and make a difference. The lay members serve for three years. Members are also invited to attend Christ Church's PCC meetings, which occur about six times a year.
