

Reflection

In Paul's second letter to the Corinthians, Paul seems to be replying to a challenge from the Corinthian church that he is only bold when he writes to them, but when he is actually face-to-face with them, he is timid, saying that "His letters are weighty and forceful, but in person he is unimpressive and his speaking amounts to nothing." If only they could have seen beyond their own lack of Christlikeness, to Paul's beautiful Christlikeness that would earn him a powerful place in God's Holy Word! Sadly, humility and love seemed very far from them.

Paul's reply to them includes

"We demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ."

Hmmm...taking thoughts captive to demolish mental arguments and pretensions that are against what God says to us or about us ... for myself, that has been a long journey. I know God loves me "unconditionally, wholeheartedly and continually" - to quote Alex Buchanon, because that is what the bible says. But that knowledge, as for many, took me a very long time to travel from my head to my heart, as my thoughts would try to dismiss it saying that God only loved me because He couldn't help Himself - a bit like a programmed robot - He couldn't possibly love me for "me". As for trying to take thoughts captive - I knew I should, and that it would set me free, but I didn't know how to. And there are many. many thoughts that set themselves up against the knowledge of God, that many people struggle with, some leading to unhealthy or destructive thought patterns or actions.

This is one of the things that the Freedom in Christ course addresses, and Craig Groeschel addresses in his book "Winning the War in our Minds", which Pieter has beautifully summarized, and introduced to Men's Ministry last night and our Day of Prayer this morning. You might like to go through his summary and meditate on whether anything resonates with you. I particularly love the Tractor vs Shovel power!

- Control your thoughts because your thoughts will control you!
- ii. The enemy's major weapon against us are <u>lies</u>... what lies do I believe?
 - o Genesis 3:1-5, 2 Corinthians 11:3 and Matthew 4:1-10
- iii. Where you are today is a result of your thoughts yesterday and years before
- iv. If you truly want to change your life you cannot just change your behaviour (you will eventually default); you need to change your THINKING e.g. New Year's resoluton







Conference, conference

As a family we attended ECM's (European Christian Mission) biennial conference at the end of March, which gathered missionaries from across Europe. I went expecting to meet people and hear interesting and helpful seminars, which did happen, but unexpectedly God took the opportunity to do work in my heart while I was out of my everyday routine.

More recently I attended a conference with *Perspectives* (Jack was at the last one so this was my turn) which is the church denomination we are serving in (used to be known as France Mission). It was interesting to meet people, hear about what is happening across the country and get a flavour for the organisation, which has around 80 churches and a drive to plant more.



Mission week - an encouragement all round

One of the things that has stood out for me recently has been a 10-day visit from 7 young adults from our sending church in Durham. They were an encouragement in so many ways, such as:

- Attending the local Christian union at the university, where they joined in with a social and a Bible study, at a time of year when the group were low in numbers due to exam season
- Going to a worship night with an ecumenical community called Chemin Neuf
- Getting to the community centre at 7am to help Jack move tables and prepare for the Braderie (jumble sale) at the community centre.
- Offering 1-1 English conversation with the class I teach at the community centre
- Helping paint the outside of the church building and clear the church yard of weeds and rubbish
- Joining in with a bowling youth social, with one of the team sharing their testimony
- Helping move picnic tables at the Orangerie de Beauregard campsite to prepare for a youth weekend away and worshipping with Tim and Jane from the Bless community.
- Participating in the Sunday morning service in the worship band, giving a testimony and preaching
- ...and more!



Giving the youth a <<Boost>> in their spiritual lives

The Weekend Boost was a weekend for 12-18 year olds in the region. There were games, camping, meals together, themed workshops (e.g. Jack ran one on science and faith), worship times (I was leading the band), testimonies from young adults, and teaching altogether on the theme of 'what is the hope for young people in 2023?. We had over 50 young people come, which for a first time was super encouraging. A Christian couple hosted at their wonderful campsite which had great facilities enabling us to run things both in and outside. I was touched by how engaged the youth were in worship.

- Give thanks for the youth weekend away, and pray for long term fruit in their lives.
- Give thanks for the team from the UK and the encouragement they were.
- Give thanks for the time away at the conference with ECM.
- For us to continue to build friendships in church and with neighbours.
- For the centre region of France where there are many fewer pastors than churches, for encouragement and God's provision of people to lead and serve.
- Ben's frequent ear infections.
