Lean into the Spirit

As we prepare our hearts and minds for prayer today, may I suggest we spend a few moments to clear our heads of the busyness of our lives. Whilst we are still spending time on 'things of the world' it's hard to really spend time with God.

This does not mean that what we are thinking about is wrong or a problem for God, it's just that to really enter into His presence we need to lift the weight we carry and focus on Jesus. You may find complete quiet helps, or music (probably instrumental only) or another meditative action, like running (not for me) or walking. Importantly, it will get us in a state where we can lean into the Holy Spirit.

I love how, in the Old Testament, the prophets often seemed to have God on speed dial!

"Then he said to me, "This is what the Lord says to Zerubbabel: It is not by force nor by strength, but by my Spirit, says the Lord of Heaven's Armies."" Zechariah 4:6 NLT

This immense power of the Holy Spirit now lives inside of us, thanks to King Jesus. So, as we pray, let us not forget that we are fighting with spiritual weapons that are far greater than the weapons of this world.

Now as we kneel before God let us pray prayers that will wow us into belief:

- restoration in relationships where all love seems lost.
- healing in bodies where human solutions have drawn a blank.
- abundance in situations where there seems nothing but anxiety.
- gushing hope and enthusiasm where there is only darkness.

Pray to Jesus to make himself known in each and every situation we lay before Him - and he will show up like we never expected!


