

# Reflection

I read a very familiar verse this week, but through a slightly different perspective and emphasis. This verse sits within the famous 'Sermon on the mount' as told by Matthew. In chapter 7, under a heading 'Effective Prayer' we read in verse 8:

"For everyone who asks, receives. Everyone who seeks, finds. And to everyone who knocks, the door will be opened."

A well-known verse from probably the best known sermon; but this time it just seemed fresh and different to me. So maybe it's me, where I am and what's going on in my life - and now God wants to talk to me in a new way through this familiar verse.... wow the Bible is just so brilliant like that; God's Word... alive today to speak to me.

Never before have I so wanted to be 'everyone'. Jesus here gives some incredible assertions when I ask, when I seek and when I knock; because Jesus says EVERYONE! Amen

I think I have always focused mainly on the 'asking', quite a lot on the 'seeking' and probably not enough of the 'knocking'. To me knocking is quite an active word, more so than asking and seeking. It feels to me knocking suggests some force, just enough to make a noise, just enough that the door will be opened.

As we pray together today; I want to suggest we bring our whole hearts to God; the burdens, the pain, the injustice, the scars that just won't heal properly. And as we pray, let's focus on 'effective prayer'; as we graduate our conversation with the Lord, from 'asking', to 'seeking' and finally to vigorously 'knocking'; because the doors will be opened and on the other side we will find the loving arms of God! Amen

# Haberdashery <u>a</u>pp<u>eal</u>



I'm sure many of you

will have heard of Tools with a Mission (TWAM) and the amazing work they do sending pre-loved tools to Africa. But did you know they also send sewing machines and haberdashery kits?

TWAM are currently desperately short of the following haberdashery items:

- Bias binding, lace, interfacing, ribbons, elastic, shirring elastic, Velcro, cords, braids and trims, part reels of cottons, pins, safety pins, needles, thimbles, fastenings including hooks and eyes and press-studs, overlocking cottons, buttons, scissors of different sizes-the older ones for sharpening, buttons and toggles, patterns.
- Fabric all sizes, as any not suitable for sending to Africa can be used for bags and tool rolls for kits. This includes pillows, duvets and sheets which we cut for bags of different sizes; curtains -we use the fabric; upholstery materials and tools.
- Containers for pins TWAM used to use photo film boxes but now need to look for other small containers – TicTac boxes are ideal!
- The wool department also needs crochet hooks, darning needles, row counters, needle gauges, machine and hand-knitting wool.

If you have any of the items above and are able to donate them to this fantastic charity, please could you leave them in the labelled box at the back of Church.
