A letter from Sharon and Andi -

Dear lovely, kind, generous, beautiful Christ Church,

Psalm 84: 4 (Amplified Bible)

Blessed and greatly favoured are those who dwell in Your house and Your presence;

They will be singing Your praises all the day long.

Blessed and highly favoured -

God is so utterly good to those who love Him and we have felt so very blessed and highly favoured!

But first things first - Thank you so much for all the love you have shown us over the last four weeks. Thank you for all the cards, flowers, gifts, offers of help and offers of food – every single one has been treasured. Thank you for all the practical help that has been given – some of it way above and beyond the call of duty – every single act has been treasured. Thank you for all the prayers that have been said – every prayer is a powerful weapon and all have been treasured. And thank you to all those who have stepped in and organised, worked and helped to make sure the church kept running smoothly – you are all precious jewels. Thank you.

It has been a painful four weeks. While returning from a lovely retreat and holiday, we were on the M1 passing through Bedfordshire when a lorry swiped us from behind. This is a photo of the front of our car. The back wasn't much better.



We had been hit and sent spinning, causing us to hit the crash barrier at least three if not four times.

As I was lying in hospital strapped to a scoop board, my head and hips locked in restraint, underneath me the broken bits of glass and gravel that had accumulated on the side of the motorway, shivering as I was nearly naked under the blanket as the ambulance crew had cut my clothes off, and in severe pain, I said to God with some reproach "I had prayed to You for protection!"

In His infinite mercy He replied instantly in a voice as clear as a bell saying "I did protect you", and in that moment I felt a flood of peace and warmth fill my heart. I had a momentary impression of what might have happened if He hadn't protected us, and I was overwhelmed with gratitude. What a miracle He had done for us. What love He has for us and what a great and awesome and glorious God we serve!

My scans in the hospital showed no broken bones or internal bleeding, but soft tissue injuries and a very aggravated spine. Andi was far more fortunate than me, with whiplash and a few cuts and bruises to his arm. We are so grateful to God for His mercy!

We lost quite a few belongings as we had our holiday suitcases and bags and stuff in the boot which exited onto the motorway at 60mph. Andi lost the most with his laptop and guitar being two of the casualties, but how little belongings matter when God has given us life! The thoughts of the policeman who picked up our dirty washing off the motorway has helped with an extra dose of humility (3)

Since then, we have felt the Lord closely with us almost continually, and there are times when I can almost feel His loving arms around me. He has been quick to answer our prayers and there have been so many small miracles He has done for us, we can barely remember what they all are!

He is the God who loves His children passionately, and protects us. Maybe we will never know how many times He has protected us from something worse as we have gone through life? He is the God who blesses and highly favours His children. He is the God who works miracles for His children. The greatest miracle being that He came to Earth to die for us so that when we face death, we won't have to face the horror of judgement for all our sins. Hallelujah! Thank you Lord. I for one am so grateful!

On the practical front - Andi is back at work doing admin and prep, but he may not be up to being in church before Sunday 17th. It will take me a little while longer. I have come a long way in my healing, but I still have a long way to go. I start physiotherapy next week and if all goes well, I am hopeful for the possibility to return to work in October. In the meantime, Anna knows what is happening if you have any questions.

We are so looking forward to coming back to see people again – we have missed you all!
