LBC News

Dear friends, greetings from Latvia!!!

The new academic year has finally arrived!





The theme for the opening of this academic year was "The Fatherhood of God". The Lord put on Victor's heart to preach on the parable of the Prodigal son where the character of God's heart as a father is revealed. He is a generous, loving and forgiving Father. It's imperative for us to get to know Him not only in our studies, but in our life. It is our prayer and hope that the studies @ LBC will help our students to get to know the Father. (Lk 15:11-32)

As our usual practice @ LBC before the beginning of the academic year we pray and fast. Our desire is always the same – we want the Lord to send us the 'right' students – those who want to grow in the Lord and His Word. This year wasn't exception.

We have 60 new students on 4 different programs, and they are even joining us from different countries. This year we will have 12 students from Portugal joining LBC program on 'Counselling in the Local Church' as well as a student from Belgium and Latvian students coming from all over Latvia!



We were very happy to see the new students coming from different ages, nationalities, professions, churches, and denominations, but all of them are eager to learn and to grow in their faith and ministry.



It was also wonderful to see a good number - 12 aspiring new preachers in joining the existing 1-year group on the program of "School of Preaching". It was evident from the first evening that all of them are eager either to improve their preaching skills or to learn the 'art of preaching'. We are grateful for the hard work of Ephraim, who is a coordinator for this group and puts a lot of work in spending his time with the small groups of preachers, who study and have fellowship in small groups in between the teaching sessions.



LBC needs

We live in the shadow of the ongoing war in Ukraine, which affects all of us. LBC is not an exception, and the rising costs of utilities and food puts considerable pressure on the finances of LBC. We realize that we need to find some additional sources of income for LBC as a ministry to maintain the same level of staff and to afford the ongoing 'operations of LBC' like paying salaries, etc. If anyone of you know of any foundations which provide grants for institutions like LBC, we would be most grateful for any advice/help.

We can reduce the electricity bills for example by investing into Solar panels, but the cheapest quote that we've got is 11000 Euros. We also need to prepare for the winter and to buy a small snow machine (the estimate for a good one is around 2000 Euros). If anyone is interested or willing to contribute to any of those needs, please write to me directly.
