How do we respond to fear?

We don't need to look too far to find something that scares us. I look at the news and wars, natural disasters and human callousness scares even the bravest of souls.

It's been said that we cannot always control what happens to us, but we can control how we respond to what happens to us.

"The Lord is my light and my salvation - whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life - of whom shall I be afraid? When the wicked advance against me to devour me, it is my enemies and my foes who will stumble and fall. Though an army besiege me, my heart will not fear; though war break out against me, even then I will be confident. One thing I ask from the Lord, this only do I seek; that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to gaze on the beauty of the Lord and to seek him in his temple." Psalms 27:1-4 NIV

As we spend time with God today in prayer - please join me in asking God to guide us into His loving arms when we are afraid. It can be so easy to panic and respond out of our own weakness; but if we focus on these verses of Psalm 27, we choose to respond to what is happening to us; but we respond as people that are saved by the blood of Christ.



Gift Day – Sunday 26th November 2023

Dear Friends

As we approach our annual Gift Day, I thought it would be a good time to let you know the present position of the church finances. As you may well be aware we now have been living off our reserves for some years. Our reserves are now quite low and will be unable to cover significant losses going forward.

I reported at last year's AGM that during the previous 4 years we had sustained a total loss of £102,000. Last year, thanks to some very generous legacies of £47,000 we were able to show a surplus for that year of £20,000, reducing the 4-year loss to £82,000.

Sadly, showing that despite every effort to contain our overheads we are looking at a loss of a further £37,000 this year and we have produced a budget that projects a loss of £54,000. next year. Clearly these losses cannot continue and a detailed discussion will be held at our next PCC meeting on 27th November.

So why are we making such large losses? Set out below are some, but not all of the reasons:

- 1. We have reduced numbers in our congregation.
- 2. We have sadly lost some very generous givers.
- Inflation has hit many people's pockets, so donations have not kept up with our rising costs. (Despite this so many of you still give generously and sacrificially)
- 4. Electricity and Gas costs have doubled.
- 5. Our Parish share has increased from £78,000 last year to £89,000 next year.
- 6. We have had to make repairs that we have been holding off for a few year's now.
- 7. Inflation has hit the church in the same way as it has for many of you.

I am detailing below some suggestions as to ways we can increase income and reduce expenditure which will be a basis of discussion at the PCC meeting.

Please pray for our situation which in many ways is better than what is faced by a number of churches.

INCREASE INCOME:

- 1. Attract more people to join our congregation.
- Ask people to give a little more each week. If 100
 people gave an extra £2.50 a week (less than the
 price of a cup of coffee) this would increase our
 income by over £12,000.
- 3. Encourage people to volunteer to run fundraising events, quizzes, socials etc.

REDUCE EXPENDITURE:

- 1. Write asking for a reduction in our Parish Share as it is at a level that is hard to sustain.
- Look at where/if reductions can be made to our mission partners.
- From next year we are reducing the full cafe to just Friday's with the hope that we can have the Wednesday cafe run by volunteers serving home-made cake and drinks. This will reduce the loss the café makes by at least 60%.
- 4. We have replaced our Church examiner for someone who will do an equally good job saving us two thousand pounds.

Please feel free to speak to me or any member of the finance team and discuss any worries or concerns you may have and equally any ideas that can be put forward to reduce our loss.

May God bless your continued support.
