Give thanks!

As some of you may know, a few of months ago, Tracy and I did a cycle ride for a charity that raises money for children with severe learning disabilities or terminal illness. We had a great time and cycled some challenging and beautiful roads to and around Brugge for three days. One of the highlights for us was, on the last day of the event, we got to ride with a young lad called Dylan. He was such an inspiration, and it was brilliant to join him on the specially modified 2-person trike he was riding (which the charity bought for his school the year before).

Dylan is now 20 and his story is so incredibly heart wrenching. Dylan was diagnosed as a one-year-old with right sided hemiplegia and diagnosed with epilepsy when he was 4 years old. His parents were informed he may never walk or talk, oh how wrong they were! Dylan's seizures got progressively worse and complex; eventually coming to a head in 2012 when he was diagnosed with Constant Spike Wave Syndrome, where the brain doesn't get a chance to shut down due to seizure activity and Dylan's brain was regressing. Great Ormond Street offered Dylan life changing surgery, resulting in them disconnecting the whole left-hand side from the right side of his brain and removed half of it!

Dylan survived and is now an awesome young man with THE best sense of humour!!

We became friends during that period and have stayed in touch since. We then had the joy of seeing him again at the annual charity ball last Saturday evening. What struck both Tracy and I was the constant joy Dylan exuded; to the point when we asked him how he was, he could not stop telling us how happy he is and how well things are going for him... let me tell you, every day is a struggle for this young man, from the minute he wakes up to the point when he falls asleep at night! But he is thankful & focuses on the good things in his life.

Please join me as we read through the Psalms 107 together. In verse one it starts with:

"Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever."

I truly believe a thankful attitude enhances our happiness and makes the challenges we face, so much more tolerable.

Now what I noticed whilst reading these Psalms is the repetitive nature of the following verse:

"Let them give thanks to the Lord for his unfailing love and his wonderful deeds for mankind,"

This verse repeats no less than four times, in verses 8,15, 21 & 31; and then chapter 107 finishes with the following in verse 42:

"Let the one who is wise heed these things and ponder the loving deeds of the Lord."

As we pray together this day let us list the things, we are thankful for. Take it slowly and name them before God and thank Him for every detail - Amen.

Dear Friends

As we approach our annual Gift Day, I thought it would be a good time to let you know the present position of the church finances. As you may well be aware we now have been living off our reserves for some years. Our reserves are now quite low and will be unable to cover significant losses going forward.

I reported at last year's AGM that during the previous 4 years we had sustained a total loss of £102,000. Last year, thanks to some very generous legacies of £47,000 we were able to show a surplus for that year of £20,000, reducing the 4-year loss to £82,000.

Sadly, showing that despite every effort to contain our overheads we are looking at a loss of a further £37,000 this year and we have produced a budget that projects a loss of £54,000. next year. Clearly these losses cannot continue and a detailed discussion will be held at our next PCC meeting on 27th November.

So why are we making such large losses? Set out below are some, but not all of the reasons:

- 1. We have reduced numbers in our congregation.
- 2. We have sadly lost some very generous givers.
- Inflation has hit many people's pockets, so donations have not kept up with our rising costs. (Despite this so many of you still give generously and sacrificially)
- 4. Electricity and Gas costs have doubled.
- 5. Our Parish share has increased from £78,000 last year to £89,000 next year.
- 6. We have had to make repairs that we have been holding off for a few years now.
- 7. Inflation has hit the church in the same way as it has for many of you.

I am detailing below some suggestions as to ways we can increase income and reduce expenditure which will be a basis of discussion at the PCC meeting.

Please pray for our situation which in many ways is better than what is faced by a number of churches.

INCREASE INCOME:

- 1. Attract more people to join our congregation.
- 2. Ask people to give a little more each week. If 100 people gave an extra £2.50 a week (less than the price of a cup of coffee) this would increase our income by over £12,000.
- 3. Encourage people to volunteer to run fundraising events, quizzes, socials etc.

REDUCE EXPENDITURE:

- 1. Write asking for a reduction in our Parish Share as it is at a level that is hard to sustain.
- 2. Look at where/if reductions can be made to our mission partners.
- 3. From next year we are reducing the full cafe to just Friday's with the hope that we can have the Wednesday cafe run by volunteers serving home-made cake and drinks. This will reduce the loss the café makes by at least 60%.
- 4. We have replaced our Church examiner for someone who will do an equally good job saving us two thousand pounds.

Please feel free to speak to me or any member of the finance team and discuss any worries or concerns you may have and equally any ideas that can be put forward to reduce our loss.

May God bless your continued support.
