Reflection

I have, for some time now, been quite conscious how often I read or watch the News... whilst I am very conscious that it is important to stay abreast of current affairs, I also want to ensure that what enters my mind and my heart is uplifting and not poisonous. If I am honest, it may also be that some part of me would like to live without knowing about all the atrocities going on in the world!

But earlier this week I found myself watching the news late one night, and maybe because I don't get an overload every day, I was truly disturbed (and haunted) by some of the footage and stories surrounding the ongoing war in Gaza. I did not engage with the topic in a sense of who is right and who is wrong, but on a human level, as a dad, as a husband, a friend, a businessman. My takeaway from watching was that I should get on my knees and pray, because what is going on is just not right! I would love to use the phrase so often used, "we are better than this"; but we clearly are not. Mankind is evil; the fact that people can do what they are doing to others, not just in the case of war, but in dozens of other 'news' articles, is pure evil. You can watch any David Attenborough nature documentary, and you will find it hard (I would argue impossible) to match the hateful behaviour you see displayed by humans!

As we pray together today; may I suggest with the backdrop described above, we might all be lost for words. All we can do is to surrender before God because we know that God is Love!

Also, please read Ezekiel 37 with me, headed "The Valley of Dry Bones". God will create life where we can see only death and in verse 10 it says: "So I prophesied as he commanded me, and breath entered them; they came to life and stood upon their feet - a vast army."

So, as we kneel before our Creator, knowing how flawed and broken we are; we clearly need saving... and who better to save us than a Saviour!! No matter how we struggle to figure out the inequalities and challenges around us, it always become clear that we need some Divine intervention....

Lord as we prepare our hearts for Christmas, celebrating the intervention of You, the living God, into our ordinary and sometimes desperate lives - ease our aching hearts to accept Jesus! - Amen
