Reflection

As we continue during this period of advent, preparing our hearts and minds for the celebration of our Saviour's birth, it is so easy to get distracted by the word around us. Be it preparing for family holiday time together, which can be joyful and stressful in equal measure; going to work or other Christmas parties; there is so much that is contending for our time or attention during this period.

Whilst many of these contenders for our 'bandwidth' *are* wholesome and sometimes necessary in themselves, it is worthwhile pausing and intentionally making time for Jesus. Unsurprisingly the very best example we have for this is our Lord Jesus himself:

"Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed." - Mark 1:35 NIV

If that's what it took for Jesus to have some time with his Father; then I want to do the same.

It may not be practical to mirror exactly how Jesus did it but I believe God wants us to remove ourselves from any distractions, whatever they may be (including the wholesome ones) to just be quiet with Him.

Lord God, we pray that you show us where and how we can access our 'solitary place' and that we 'go there' in obedience.

Lord, we ask that you put on our hearts to pray for others, whilst thanking you for what you have done in our lives.

Lord, please reveal to us what you want to say to us by the people you have placed in our lives and the circumstances we find ourselves in.

Let this time of advent be a time of rejuvenation and encouragement - Amen



Dear friends, greetings from Latvia!!!

The Advent season is upon us and that means that the most exciting festival of Christmas is coming! At times we don't feel joyful looking at the news and what's happening in the Ukraine and in the land where our Saviour was born. Yet, this period is a time for reflection and anticipation. "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" (which means "God with us"). Matthew 1:23 NIV These words were reassuring then and now.

As we reported in our previous newsletter we had 60 new students on 4 different programs, and they joined us from different countries.

We wanted to give you a 'taste' of what's happening at LBC this academic term.

School of Preaching



I am Aivars Treimanis and I study in the 'School of Preaching'. In my 'daily life' I work as a heating and engineer plumbing and in the 'Church life' I work as a youth leader and involved in the Church Multiplication Mission as Latvian coordinator. The study

at LBC is very interesting – it is the place where I meet students from different churches and denominations. As a part of learning process we go to preach to different churches and the amazing thing is that it doesn't matter whether I am in a church of my own denomination or another - we have one Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

The acquired knowledge of the specific topic of homiletics gives the knowledge of how to correctly compose sermons in different ways and for different target audiences. I have realized that there is not only one way to make sermons, but there are many different ways to present the message of the Bible to different groups and different ages. Further, as the coordinator of the ministry of the Church Multiplication Mission in Latvia, this is a good opportunity to get to know and make contacts with representatives from different denominations and congregations. It gives us a possibility of establishing a new church or a small group in every populated place in Latvia, which proclaims the Gospel message and the testimony of Jesus.

My name is Linda. started studies at LBC as a young Christian, housewife, and mother of a 3-year-old son. My husband is the unbeliever. I know that God called me to LBC. I started with program 'Theology and Ministry'
