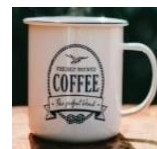

Hello all, thank you for taking the time to pray and to read our newsletter! Do be in touch to let us know how things are with you too. Here's what we've been up to since we last wrote at the start of October.

Youth-led worship night

The youth-led worship night on the 4th November saw four churches partnering together to worship and to do a bake sale in aid of the charity associated with the Baptist church (which distributes clothing and hygiene items to those in need).

Christmas celebrations in Loches and Tours Nord

This Christmas I stepped back from planning the Tours Nord Christmas service and it was led by Marc and Jody, although I did sing soprano in the choir. There were songs interspersed with sketches performed by the children. The room had been decorated by the youth during a social (which also left the room with a lingering smell of cheese after we shared a raclette, but we won't dwell on that...). It was wonderful to see church members of all ages involved in different capacities in the service.

The Loches Christmas service was a delight to serve in, in spite of recently recovering from a nasty sinus infection. I offered to help the lady who does most of the worship leading there out with music, and she chose 11 songs! These were interspersed with a retelling of the Christmas story. I played a mixture of piano and flute. It was nice to be in a supporting role. The room was full of people, including many of those doing the youth alpha course, and various friends of church members, which was a delight.

1-1s

Jack and I have been doing various 1-1 discipleship meetups. I've met up with a young person to prepare her for baptism and a lady who can't make it to church on a Sunday morning who has recently become a Christian, and Jack has been meeting up with a couple of different men in the church. It is encouraging to take time to pray and read the Bible together and to get to know each other a bit more.

Interview in Paris with the leaders of the denomination (*Perspectives*)

Back in November, Jack and I spent the day in Paris - not *en amoureux* but instead for an interview with the leaders of the denomination we're working with, to discuss becoming *collaborateurs* and also options for what working together might look like in the future (church-planting, or traditional church leadership etc). It was good to get the chance to discuss face to face with them.

Jack's sermon series and Sarah's first ever preach

Marc has delegated to Jack the task of choosing the sermon series for the church at Tours Nord. We're currently in the Gospel of Luke. In November, I did my first ever preach in Loches on Romans 6. I was helped by a lady who sometimes preaches in our church with perfecting my french and with public speaking skills. It went very well!

Alpha is starting next Tuesday (the 16th).
May God use it to bring people closer to Jesus.

Prayer points:

- On the 18th January will be the Christians in Dialogue Ecumenical Celebration, at which the donation will be taken for Open Doors (to support the persecuted church). Do pray for ecumenical dialogue in the city to be fruitful and for the love of christians of different denominations for one another to be a witness to people outside the church.
- This term on Tuesday evenings we're launching an Alpha course. Do pray for people to come (particularly seekers and new christians) and for it to be useful to them.
- Praise God for the christmas celebrations, in particular for the Loches service where lots more people than normal came.
- Praise God for some new people coming to our church who want to get stuck in.
- Blessings on us as a family
- For the church to continue to grow and for new believers and seekers
- Good use of the church's building. Since the building work is almost finished, we hope to find groups to partner with who could make good use of the space during the week.
- Discernment of what the future may hold for us un ministry.
- Youth work and the youth. Planning for this year's weekend boost (for 12-18 years olds) is already underway. I'm running a girls' social next month to try to build community amongst the teenage girls (2 of whom only joined the church since Easter last year). I'm considering planning another inter-church youth-led worship night this term but lots of pieces are yet to fall into place.

- I'll be leading a discussion on the theme of worship leading with the pastors in the denomination at our next regional meeting. Do pray that it is useful.
- Jack is exploring what it might be like to become a prison chaplain in France. Do pray for him as he discerns whether or not this would be a good thing for him to pursue.
- We're hoping to welcome a mission team for a week over the Easter period. Do pray that things fall into place to make that a reality.
- Jack is still leading a men's breakfast and the preachers' club. Do pray that both would be edifying to individuals and to the church. May God raise up preachers to build up his church!
