Ambassador and diplomacy

Most of the work of ambassadors and diplomats is done behind the scenes, out of sight. When we notice them, that means something has gone horribly wrong - diplomatic relations are tense, an incident has occurred, or even worse a crisis of some kind is underway. Currently, with the Israeli hostage situation and fighting in Gaza, diplomacy has come out of the shadows. Critically, their success is usually linked to the relationships they have built up over many years whilst out of the limelight.

Here is one definition of an ambassador: an official envoy, especially a diplomatic agent of the highest rank accredited to a foreign government or sovereign as the resident representative of his or her own government or sovereign or appointed for a special and often temporary diplomatic assignment.

Jesus was, of course, an amazing ambassador. Sent by the Father, He was an envoy of the highest rank. He was, and is, the exact representation of the Father who came on assignment to Earth, bridging the gap between mankind and God.

2 Corinthians 5:20 talks about **our** role as ambassadors:



We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: be reconciled to God.

We follow in Jesus's footsteps, representing Him to our family and friends. Sent as envoys

in the same way, God calls us to form 'diplomatic relations' with others, appealing to them to come to Jesus. Most of this will take place 'behind the scenes' as it were, in low key conversations. However, when something happens - loss of a job, a bereavement or illness perhaps - we may be called on to listen, to explain what is happening, and to represent God in that situation. And it may all depend on the relationships we've forged in the good times. Let's pray that we would be faithful ambassadors for Jesus, representing Him as accurately as we can, and acting as a bridge to the Father.

This course is for everyone who wishes to deepen their relationship with God and to walk in the joyful freedom which He has especially for **YOU**.


It begins on Tuesday 16th April and ends on Tuesday 25th **June**. We meet at 7 for 7.30pm start and finish around 9.30pm.
