

#### Reflection

As some of you may know, last week I participated in a charity cycle from London to Amsterdam. It was a wonderful experience with great people and a beautiful cause. I can also confirm it was gruelling at times against winds, rain, sand storms and horizontal hail...

Would I do it again? YES absolutely;)

Now I am no expert cyclist, but I was aware that riding in a group is much easier than riding alone. Studies show that riders positioned in the middle of a group exert between 25-50% less energy than you would riding alone. Over the four days of cycling, I experienced this more than ever before and I realised if I pushed too far ahead or fell behind it made for a much harder ride. I made a conscious effort to remain with the pack, which made the day's cycling much easier. This tactic used to tremendous efficiency by elite and professional cyclists is something from which us Christians can learn so much.

Together we gain strength in the Lord, we get pulled along and lifted up by fellow-believers, so when the time comes when we are just exhausted; then we can get pulled along by our brothers and sisters in Christ.

"And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another - and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

Hebrews 10:24-25 NIV

Now I have been blessed enough to experience this lift, this unexpected 'free-ride' in both cycling and my Christian life, when believers around me give me strength to carry on well beyond my own capability.

As we pray together let us thank God for these faithful friends that ride alongside us in life, and let us ask God that each one of us will be ready to let our friends and loved ones get inside our slipstream during their time of need.
