Isaiah 42

He would come in God's Spirit to bring justice to the world. He would do this in gentleness, and be faithful to His calling to the bitter end of Easter. And in doing this He would give us hope – hope of a life free from sin, hope of a life spent with Him; hope of an eternal life in Heaven!

And this was not just for Israel, but for the whole world – which means us too! To give us eyes to see what is Real and what is sham, to set people free from the prison of sin, hate, anger, addiction, and all the things that stop us having life, and life in all its fullness; and teach us what God's good and true way is, and help us turn away from our self-centred, often

distorted, way. He came into the world to save us, when we had no hope of saving ourselves.

That is something to truly celebrate this Christmas! God loves celebrations. He gave the Israelites one day a week off to rest, relax, do no work, and enjoy Him; and He insisted that all their servants and animals had this rest too. He gave them several extra festivals throughout the year where they could celebrate and enjoy rest, each other, and sit in His presence. And He has given us, those who hope in Him, the birth of His Son to celebrate too, and rekindle again that hope that gets tarnished and dulled with all the difficulties that happen in life throughout the year.

If you feel able to come and celebrate Jesus' birth with us in person, please look at our services section as things do change. If the government regulations change or the Church of England regulations change from now onwards we will send you an email. But at the moment, we are able to go ahead with our services using masks, hand sanitising, distancing, and ventilation.

If you aren't able to come and celebrate with us, we are hoping to stream the Carols by Candlelight service to our Facebook site.

So this Christmas, we hope and pray that you will have a wonder-filled, joy-filled and peace-filled celebration, and that 2022 will be happy and healthy.

Bishop Simon Christmas 2021

In Bishop Simon's Christmas message to the people and parishes of Medway, north and west Kent and the London Boroughs of Bromley and Bexley in the Diocese of Rochester, he reflects on the true reality of the first nativity.

Taking place in a messy, bug-ridden stable, this is God saying, 'I've been there, in the middle of shattered plans.'

Love, surely

Two years ago, *Empire* film magazine chose the top ten Christmas films of all time. You're unlikely to guess which film tops the list. It's *Die Hard*. And it started one of those huge but trivial online debates. *Die Hard* is an amazing thriller, but for many, just setting it at Christmas doesn't make two hours of killing and destruction in a skyscraper very Christmassy.

In second place was It's a Wonderful Life. Third was Elf and fourth place was occupied by the film many now associate most with Christmas: Love, Actually. The films of Richard Curtis always deliver us a particular kind of London. A place full of attractive, witty, caring friends who live in stylish loft conversions on the south bank. Who are always available to drink lattes with you in hipster, brick walled cafes and offer amusing advice on your love life as you regale them with its latest twist. A London where the streets are covered in crisp, white snow unsullied by car tyres and where the pavements are full of generous, smiling strangers who laugh when you bump into them and make clever and kindly remarks as you pass by.

Can someone please tell us where this London is?

It's been described as richardcurtisland, and it's pretty much how we see the Christmas nativity scene. The stable is warm and cosy. The stars shine brightly in the sky. The cattle are neatly arranged around the baby. Mary has a smile broader and whiter than a youthful Donny Osmond. The hay is inviting like a fluffy pillow. And the shepherds get the first selfies with the baby in the background.

The reality would have been very different. Dingy, bugridden stable. Perilous birth among farm animals. No post-natal care or wider family on hand. And a paranoid and ruthless leader in Herod, hot on their tails. If ever anyone were entitled to say: I'm a celebrity, get me out of here, it was the Son of God at his birth. There was no pomp and ceremony for Jesus. No luxury or comfort. He began life downwardly mobile.

The nativity story sends us a coded message we easily miss. It's there for all whose lives are taking a wrong

turning, which is so many more people than would have been true two Christmases ago. Many of our lives are messed up like that stable. The pandemic may well have done this to us. Even if it hasn't, we are frequently tempted to pretend to others we're totally sorted when we're not because we're afraid they'll think less of us.

If we're on our knees right now, wondering how we'll get through Christmas and stay afloat in the new year, I believe God is saying to us: I've been there, in the middle of shattered plans. Like James Stewart's character in It's a Wonderful Life, we mean more to others than we could possibly imagine. And we are loved by God in Christ with a love deeper than the deepest stars in space.


A month of the partial lockdown come and gone, but LBC's life continues. Latvian government-imposed restrictions affected our ministry but didn't stop it. We had to adapt to the existing conditions and to carry on our programs in the mixed regime. That meant that those who are vaccinated could come physically to LBC and sit in the classroom with others watching ongoing lectures via YouTube. All functioned well, though not seeing our students physically did affect the whole of dynamic.

Programs covered:

- OT & NT overviews
- The environment of the NT
- Pauline epistles



School of Preachers covered important themes such as Creativity in Preaching, Preaching on Special occasions like weddings, funerals, baptism services, etc.



LBC together with the organization "Society of possibilities" organized a seminar on the theme of "Invalids and Christian community" to educate regarding different issues in relation to invalids and how to reach them out with the gospel. Latvia still has a post-Soviet mentality and prejudice towards invalids. Although our society is changing slowly, the prevailing attitude still is that the invalids are invalids and they deserve compassion and mercy, rather than treating them as human beings with a certain potential. The invalids are also the most unreached part of Latvian society.

CWS

We are happy to inform you that we are currently in the negotiations with a "Realis" seminary in Ukraine regarding CWS program in Ukraine. As you probably know Ukraine is a highly corrupted country and is in urgent need of "evangelizing" its workplace and business. There is a need for programs like ours to be developed, so that Christians could bring the "salt and light" into their workplace.

The other potential development could be also in Belarus where some leaders from the Baptist union expressed interest in this program.

Prayer needs

- ➤ <u>Praise</u> the Lord for the programs and students who attended these courses. Despite lockdown and restrictions our students still show a great interest in studies.
- ➤ **Pray for:** The continuation of a good partnership between LBC and seminary in Ukraine and Belarus.
- ➤ Our librarian's (Arija) husband is dying from cancer. She needs a special grace during this Christmas.
- ➤ Our administrator Solvita buried her father back in November, but now her elderly mother is in a poor health as well as her husband. She is exhausted and tired by trying to look after them.
- ➤ We are currently advertising and recruiting the new students for CWS, BA program, post-graduate MA and PhD programs.
- > The recruitment of a new director to succeed Victor.

Thank you, dear friends, for all your prayers, support, and love for LBC's ministry. You are our partners, and we treasure the relationship and friendship with each one of you.


