## Vicar's Report

Our Awesome God has been at work through his church this year in many different ways.

In a recent Church of England report 'Future First', it found that only 18% of C of E churches grew. It also found that "Only 13% of clergy said they intended to grow". Is there a correlation? I have prayed and continue to pray that Christ Church may grow. God's 'default mode' is growth- He is the creator God of growth.

One of the questions that I ask myself- and the leadership team discuss at training events is: "What season of life are we in?" Is it a season of decay/decline, a season of dormancy/ plateauing, or growth? How should we act during this season? Well, I believe- by God's grace- we saw the beginnings of a season of growth. (May it continue in 2014/15!)

We saw growth in many of our ministries.

We have seen growth in our children's work.

More children will 'graduate' from creche to Climbers, Climbers to Explorers and Explorers to Pathfinders than in the last 10 years.

More families come to Tea and Toys than ever before and the Christian message is more overt than ever before.

We have seen growth in our care of the elderly. More people are attending our Community Club Bible Studies and being visited in hospital (when they are ill) than I ever remember.

We have seen growth in our electoral roll and growth in our Sunday attendance. Year on year, we are growing. I realise that numerical growth is only one indicator of spiritual growth. Nonetheless, it is great that God continues to numerically grow his church.

I could tell other stories about ministry areas that are growing. Where some are plateauing, faithful leaders are looking carefully at their activity and asking the right questions about why this might be. That is the right response. For a number of years, our Sunday church congregations (based upon Average Sunday Attendance) plateaued after the building project was completed. I had anticipated immediate growth after the opening of the facilities. It didn't come. "So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, who makes things grow." (1 Corinthians 3:7) We need to remain faithful in service and prayer until that time.

### There has been growth in mission too.

A number of individuals have engaged in mission trips overseas this year. The church has continued to give generously to mission beyond these four walls. For myself, I was privileged to be able to join Christian communities in Tanzania and France. We are strengthening our relationships with our mission partners through visits, use of social media and the distribution of prayer letters. We are strengthening our relationship with

Unity Church, Ramsden and other partner churches in Orpington to join together in mission.

There has been growth in the study of God's Word.

Currently, this is only anecdotal, but I am hearing of more people who are reading the Bible daily, joining in small groups for discussion. We know that around 85 people listen to/download teaching from our web sites each month. (1067 'unique' visitors go to our web site each month.) There seems to be a growth in interest in our church by the wider community. A number of people have opted to read the Bible in One Year using 'apps' on their mobile devices. All this is really encouraging!

As you can read, there is evidence of growth occurring during the course of the year 2013/14. We don't take this growth for granted, or assume it comes only from our efforts but give the glory to God. However, He does invite us to work under his rule. St. Paul writes earlier in 1 Corinthians 3:6 "I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God has been making it grow."

Are we a church of 'planters' and 'waterers'? Unpacking this analogy, we need to be those who tend the soil that the seed of God's Word may grow in the lives of those in whom it is planted. Those 'who plant' may be people who are creative, starters of project and ideas people. We need those kind of people to have a voice in the church. Those 'who water' may be faithful, care-giving people who stick at the nurturing process

for the long haul, even when there are no 'green shoots'. We need those kind of people. Added to them, we need 'pruners' (1 John 15.2) who will not shy away from asking the difficult questions about whether growth is happening, and whether healthy growth could happen if pruning occurred.

We need each other if we are to be a growing church. I thank God for each person of Christ's Church: our paid staff and faithful volunteers; our new members and long-established ones. Each one has a part to play in working with God to see Him grow His church. At the AGM, I will speak about what God is preparing for us to do in 2014/15. I can assure you that we have an exciting year ahead! May it continue to be a year of growth as we strengthen our roots and extend our branches.

## Children's Ministry

### Children's Ministry Vision

The vision for Children's Ministry is **Sowing seeds, growing together and changing lives.** We have the wonderful opportunity of helping children to know Jesus and to grow together in faith. We can change and enrich their lives by encouraging them to have a loving relationship with God. Jesus said "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these."

I am pleased to report that Children's Ministry has been thriving and we are seeing many new families coming to Christ Church, on writing we had 16 little ones in our Crèche, please pray that they feel welcome and want to make Christ Church their home. Please pray also for volunteers to support all these ministries.

Children's Ministry has also welcomed Katie Travers who is doing a Children's and Family Work & Ministry placement with us at Christ Church whilst studying with Oasis College. During her time with us she has been working with each of the Children's Sunday and mid-week groups. It is a real privilege to have her on the Children's Ministry team.

Over the last year we have started (and restarted a number) of Children's Ministries -Little Acorns...Mighty Oaks, Mini Movers at CCO, Sunday football and Families Together and I am happy to say that these have been going well. We have also looked to build on the success of Holiday Club with Holiday Club Reunion.

At **Tea & Toys** it has been another very successful and busy year with our new registration system working well. Paula and her team have been doing a fantastic job welcoming families and

ensuring a fun environment for the little ones. We now have over 100 families on our books! We thank God that we are seeing some of these families in church as well as taking part in the Alpha Course run by Judith Motto. However, numbers have increased to the point that we are now having to start a waiting list and we would appreciate your prayers for the administration of this. Please also pray that our families would see God's love in all that we do and say.

Caroline Rous has been working with Elevate Dancers who have been visiting Charterhouse Pre-school weekly for **Mini Movers** session. The children have great fun with the dancers, playing games, singing and dancing, as well as getting involved in a Bible story through movement. I am delighted to say **Mini Movers** has also started up again at Christ Church on a Friday afternoon. A small team (myself, Katie & Anna) from CCO and the Elevate dancers have been reaching out to lots of young families offering a Mini Movers session, play and refreshments. This has been proving really popular. Please thank God for this opportunity and pray that these families enjoy their time with us a learn more about Him.

**Crèche** continues to flourish under the leadership of Louise Callow, providing a fantastic introduction to church for our 0-3 year olds. Our dedicated crèche team continue to faithfully care for the children, allowing them to explore through play, and story time in a nurturing environment. The crèche allows parents to have some protected time to listen to the service and reflect and pray in a peaceful environment knowing their little ones are cared for. We strive to meet all the needs of our 0-3 year olds, allowing them to develop, through play and craft as the space will allow.

This year in **Climbers and Explorers** we have been teaching the children about the nature of God and trusting him to change us from the inside out, that life with God is an adventure and he has a plan for our lives today.

The **Climbers** team led by Caroline Rous continues to provide quality teaching and fun activities for our children. We have a mix of new families and children who have been with us since creche. This year we have introduced a new memory verse to learn each half term, and have been amazed by the children's ability to remember, often better than the adults! Steph Fargie has made special Memory Verse Boxes for the children. We ask for prayer for the children's continued eagerness to learn God's word, for more volunteers to help and for Climbers to continue to grow in number.

**Explorers** are blessed to have a fantastic team of dedicated teachers, craft leaders and helpers. We are sad this term to be saying goodbye to 13 of our Year 6 children who will be joining Pathfinders but also looking forward to welcoming the new Year 2's from Climbers. Going forward we are planning to introduce some practical ways the children can work together for God today, through prayer, giving (a Christian Aid Chicken or Antibiotics for a child) and by following God's rules and standing out from the crowd. We too are using the memory boxes introduced by Steph & Sharon. Please pray for the team and the children that together we can continue to grow closer for God and follow His plan for our lives.

Outburst led by Sharon is the session where all the children in **Climbers and Explorers** join together held on the first Sunday of every month. On a termly basis this will include, craft activities, drama sketches, dance and movement, praise and

worship and times for reflection and prayer. Elevate dancers and J4J have been working with the children enhancing the storytelling and worship. The aim of Outburst is to encourage the children to develop a personal relationship with Jesus and show them how the stories and lessons in the Bible are relevant in their lives today. Please thank God for the wonderful team and pray for the group as they work with the children.

**Sunday Football.** We are partnering with a Christian charity Ambassadors Football, to run 6 weeks of football sessions after Sunday school. These are run by Coach Steve who is a FA qualified coach. During the sessions the children have been playing football, having lots of fun in a positive environment and looking at faith in football.

**Showstoppers Holiday Club & Holiday Club Reunion** were fabulous. We had the opportunity to tell of God's great plan for his world from creation to the birth of Jesus, his death and resurrection. We had Christmas and Easter in the middle of summer! We then learnt more of God's plan for our lives with Holiday Club Reunion. This was attended by many parents and children who came for breakfast and craft.

As well as training for all our volunteers in the summer this year we held **Little Acorns...Mighty Oaks** for volunteers working with the 0-5yr olds either in toddler groups, Crèche or Sunday schools across Orpington. We gave thanks and celebrated the great work that volunteers do and offered inspiration and encouragement. In the afternoon there were practical sessions on Storytelling, Worship and Reflection, Engaging Dads and Craft. This was an opportunity to share ideas and experiences. Here are some of the comments from those that attended....'Fantastic - I have really learnt some things today

and feel very inspired. Wonderful to meet others and share!' 'A wonderful uplifting opportunity.' Hopefully we will have the opportunity to have a similar event this year

**Christingle & Families Together** The children and young people were amazing and so were all the leaders and helpers. The children told the story and meaning of the nativity in a really moving and powerful way; I was so proud of them all. The new Youth band **Jammin 4 Jesus** was fantastic and I am really excited about hearing more from them. A big thank you to Liesel for her wonderful song 'Revelation'. Again the Highway choir joined us and we had a full throng of angels singing God's praises. **Families Together** was a fun morning with breakfast, games and Christmas crafts. People had a chance to get to know each other in a relaxed and friendly atmosphere whilst the children were busy rehearsing.

The smooth running of Children's Ministry is possible through the quiet and unseen work done by our Administrator Liesel Stanbridge who does a fantastic job, please thank God for her organisation and support. Liesel also leads the **Registration team** who each week ensure the safety of the children through this invaluable process - thank you.

**Spinnaker Schools Work** During Spinnaker Prayer week the team had a special prayer event at Green Street Green with a prayer trail for the children to think about and pray for their school and an evening service. Caroline Rous is now also working with Spinnaker and together we are visiting schools in the local area taking assemblies and RE lessons. For Christmas we have been doing some wonderful activities with the children, making Advent rings (with the help of Barry Remnant), Christingles and Christmas cards looking at 'Jesus the light of

the World' and 'God's greatest gift'. Katie and Elmare Mentor have also been coming along to help. The Spinnaker Orpington team has just completed a tour of local schools with our Christmas assembly using beautifully crafted shadow puppets to tell the nativity story, focusing on God's love and 'Jesus, Light of the world'. Mrs Smith the Deputy Head of The Highway said we were 'Spinnaker's Got Talent'. This term I have had the opportunity to look at the Parables with Year 3 and Caroline is teaching Year 2 about lent. Please pray that we continue to have the opportunities to visit schools and share God's love with the children.

This is a prayer that Louise Callow wrote for Crèche but I feel it is applicable for the whole of Children's Ministry.....Dear Lord, We thank you for our Children's Ministry and give thanks to all those whom help to care for the children. We give praise for all the children in our care, please keep them safe and assist them to grow and build strong foundations in your name. Please continue to guide us in making the children's time as fulfilling as possible and for our team to work as effectively as possible for your glory. Amen.

Please continue to pray for us throughout the year ahead as your prayers are an invaluable support to our work.

## Youth Ministry

I started as Youth Minister here coming for the last day of Holiday Club 2013, and I feel very blessed to have been working alongside the young people and congregation of Christ Church for the past 7 months! I can honestly say that I smile every single day and I am excited about these young people and all their gifts. I do not work alone – the youth work team includes a number of volunteers from the congregation, some parents and some “young leaders” from the Juice group (more about this later!). I am very grateful to all these people for supporting me and the young people of Christ Church; we would not be able to run our groups without them. As well as support during sessions I also have people who pray for me and the groups, and I am very grateful for the spiritual support.

We have 17 young people on the **Pathfinders** register. Our first six months have been quite varied, getting to know each other and looking at “New Beginnings”, welcoming visitors from the congregation on Remembrance Day, doing quizzes after watching DVDs. Pathfinders read prayers at the Christingle service and acted as stewards, handing out the Christingle kits. Since Christmas we have done a Whistle stop tour of Old Testament Characters; looking at Joseph, Rahab, David and Abraham. We are looking forward to welcoming 13 young people from Explorers after Easter, and sending 5 young people to Juice once they have completed an “Apprenticeship”; a chance to work in 5 areas of the Church. We are attending Carrot Wood for the weekend 21-23 March, alongside young people from Orpington Baptist church FROG’s group.

We have 16 young people on the **Juice** register. We also thought about “New Beginnings” and on Remembrance Day we watched ‘The Hurt Locker, a film about a three-man Explosive Ordnance Disposal (bomb disposal) team during the Iraq War. It was wonderful to bring war up to date, making it relevant to the young people. Before Christmas we considered having a personal relationship with God. After Christmas I met with Jenny (Warrington) who suggested that we run the CPAS Growing Leaders (youth edition) with the Juice group as many of our young people hold leadership positions at school and within community groups. We have been looking at what it means to be a Christian leader and hope that these young people will hugely benefit from this course; they all have such great leadership potential. Our trips have included meals out, a trip on the London Eye and Ice Skating at Winter Wonderland. We are looking forward to a day at Thorpe Park, and a group may be going to Soul Survivor in August.

On Friday’s after school we host **Drop-in**, a relaxed “open youth club” where we can reach out to local young people, build relationships with them and model Jesus through various activities we do.

We host **Base** on a Saturday evening 7-9pm. I have been crying out for additional helpers as I feel a need to split this group by age profile. I would ideally like to meet 6-7.30pm for Year 7-8, and 7.30-9pm for Year 9+. At the moment we are trialling meeting on alternate weeks, but this is not ideal (and is very confusing!)



Sharon Russo and Jenny Warrington conduct our band **“Jamming with Jesus”** who performed at the Christingle Service, at Outburst, and we hope will join in some future services and play at the holiday club over summer.

**“FN@TB”** meet on alternate weeks in the Base and have lots of fun playing games, listening to music and sharing news about their weeks. This group has about 12 young people on the register and is especially aimed at young people who find large or noisy group activities difficult to cope with. We have been able to extend the invite to these young people to other youth events, such as joint Movie and Pizza Nights, and a formal Christmas meal at the end of the Autumn Term. Some group members also come to Base on a Saturday. There is a team dedicated helpers and some young mentors who help the young people enjoy activities each week.

I have one **P.O.D.** group who meet regularly, Year 13 girls, and I have met a few times with the “older boys”. I hope that we will have more small groups from next term.

I have become a part of “Fusion”; the youth team of CTiO, and we have lots of activities planned for young people throughout the year. In January I attended SoulNet, a Youth Leaders Retreat at Centre Parcs, Sherwood Forest. This was well needed at the end of 6 months into this position and a chance for me to spend some quiet time thanking God for all the gifts that he has given me. I am leading Worship and running a lunch time club at Bishop Justus School. I work well alongside Jo Gavin and the

Children's Ministry team, and as a member of the wider Church leadership team.

In addition to my report: I am also a College Pastor, attending Orpington College every week and meeting students there for a Christian Union and speaking to students and staff when on patrol.

I am looking forward to being a part of the Christ Church 75 year's celebration, and making sure that the young people all understand the importance of this event and celebrate alongside the congregation.

## **Annual Accounts 2013**

### **Summary version**

The electoral roll is updated annually and comprises 225 members, an increase of 2 since last year. The breakdown is:

Male = 86, Female = 139;  
Resident in parish = 111, Resident outside parish = 114.

The average weekly attendance during October (when the annual count is done for the Diocese) was 160 adults aged 16 or over and 49 young people aged under 16 (2012: 168 & 58).

### **Income**

Total receipts for the General Fund were £266,456 and are detailed in the Financial Statements. The proportion of donations that are gift aided was higher than in 2012 – 84% of General Fund donations when taken together with the tax recoverable, compared with 82% in 2012. The income from the hire of the hall was lower than in 2012 at £22,032 compared with £25,953 for the previous year. Income from the café was also lower £21,593 (£23,880 in 2012) but the surplus of income over expenditure at 13% was considerably higher than the 8% of 2012.

The planned giving by envelopes and standing orders to the General Fund rose by 3% to £105,348 (£127,562 with the tax recoverable; £124,270 in 2012). We are very grateful to those who give in this way as it enables the church to set a realistic budget. In addition the amount promised in Advent was £4,825 a year in increased or new standing orders. People also gave £22,198 to the General Fund in a special offertory at this time.

We are grateful to the estates of Mrs Jean Hall for a legacy of £5,000 and Mrs June Galer for a legacy of £24,167.

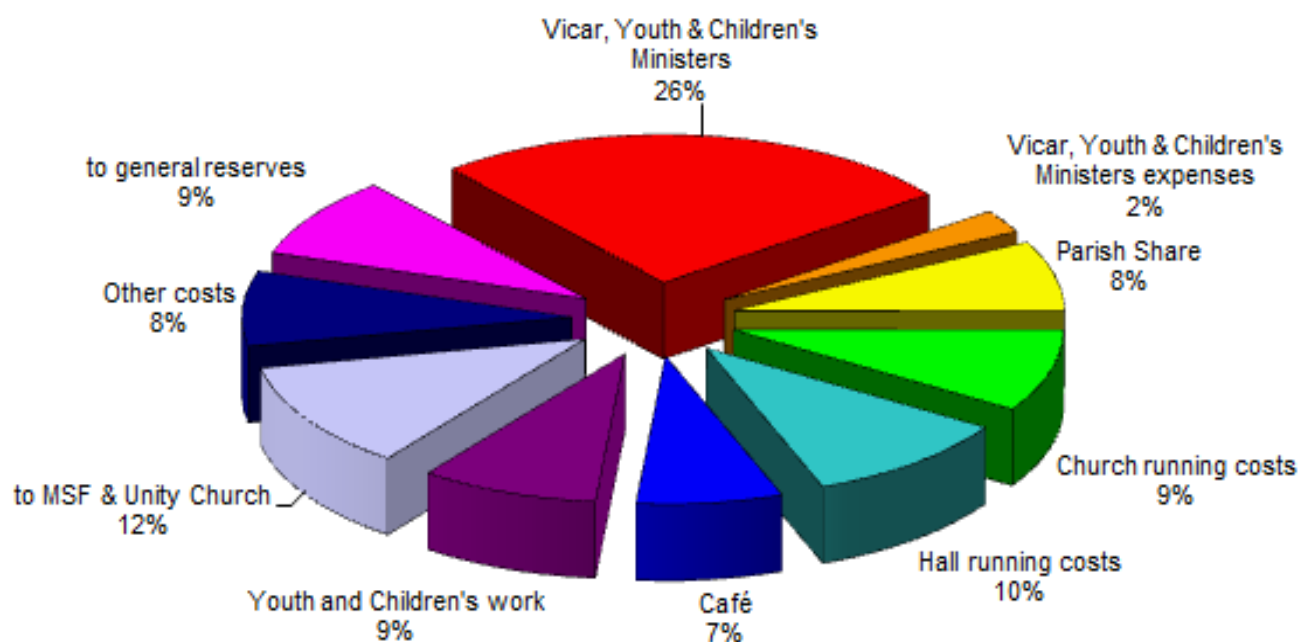

## General Fund expenditure in 2013



The net result for the general fund for the year was an excess of receipts over payments of £76,796; of this £18,200 was transferred to the Mission Support Fund, £22,000 to the Church Repair Fund and £12,970 to the Mission Fund for Unity Church. The balance carried forward at 31<sup>st</sup> December for the General Fund was £173,173; up £23,626 on the previous year.

### African Trips

Three trips to Africa were made by members of the congregation during the summer of 2013. The vicar and his family went to Kondoa, Tanzania and Jenny and Sarah Warrington and Andy and Hannah Goddard returned to Rukungiri, Uganda. Members of the congregation generously gave £16,695 towards supporting the mission work they assisted with on these trips (sent via Rochester Diocese to Kondoa and by Mission Direct to Rukungiri and to buy medical aid in the UK (to take out) and in Uganda itself).

Where possible and desirable we specified particular projects to be beneficiaries of these agencies' sums. For example Tearfund's Sagol project in Nepal, LCM's Day Centre for the Homeless at Waterloo, two SAMS projects in Lima shanty towns and Rochester Diocese's fund for work in Kondo, Tanzania. We sent the full amounts to the General Funds of the other agencies - CPAS, Release International, MAF and Spinnaker.

Sent to mission partners, usually former members of our fellowship, were then each awarded 2/3 of the agency figure, except for the Petrenkos, who were given additional funds to support their growing work at the Bible College.
